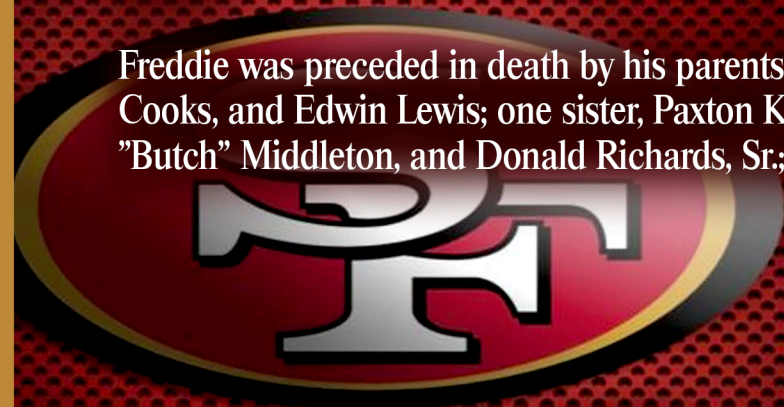

This should have been our brother's motto because whenever he and our nephews got together — there was a steady stream of to go plates leaving from under the carport or out of our kitchen.

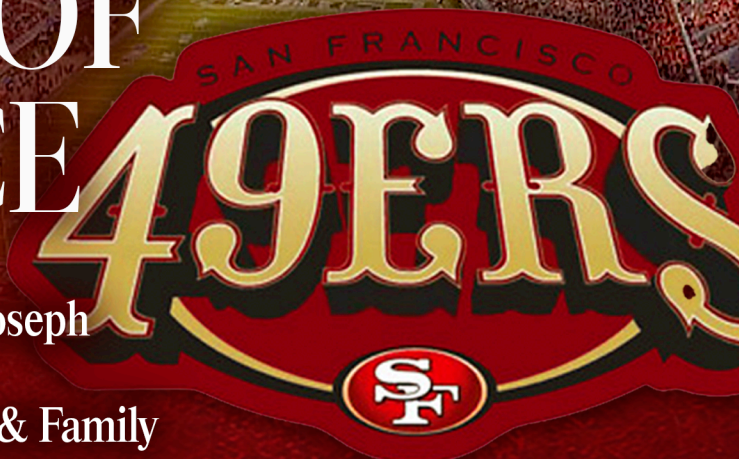
