She made every holiday pure magic and she enjoyed traveling and planning trips to new places. Tina was also a very patient teacher and loved doing things with her family. She enjoyed playing tennis and keeping up with Texas Tech sports. Every night she would search the program listings to see if there was a game on. If not Texas Tech sports, she would follow tennis tournaments or golf. She was also involved with the women's organizations of her church. She enjoyed the bible studies and fellowship. Tina was preceded in death by her parents.
