Mrs. Peggy Ann Daniel Bryant, 89, of Elberton, GA, wife of 68 years to Leon Bryant, went to be with the Lord on Wednesday, April 30, 2025, at the Rainey Hospice House in Anderson, SC.

There are many ways you could measure Peggy's life: in years, in the number of children she raised, in how many trips she took to Gatlinburg with her family, or in the number of homemade biscuits she made for those she loved. Regardless of how you measure it, one thing remains the same: Peggy lived a long life full of service to those she held most dear.
