## *Mrs. Tammy Davis*

**MRS. TAMMY DAVIS** was born to the union of Hezekiah Bell and Ella Robinson on Friday, February 22, 1963 in the city of St. Louis, MO. **Tammy** was 1 of 8 children, 5 of which preceded her in death: Erskine Bell, Joe Willie Robinson, Robert Robinson, Joesanne Rayford, and Jeffery Bell. She was also preceded in death by her parents, her beloved husband Darron Davis, and a host of others whom the angel of the LORD has recorded.

**Tammy Bell** and Darron Davis were united in Holy Matrimony on Friday, March 21, 1986. To this union, three beautiful children were born: Latasha, Demetrius, and Terrell Davis. Though their union was brief due to Darron's untimely passing, theirs was a love that was strong and endured much. So strong that **Tammy** was able to care for her husband after two debilitating strokes. It was **Tammy** who was there through all of the physical therapy sessions and numerous doctors' visits. And it was **Tammy** that was by her husband's side as he transitioned from labor to reward.

**Tammy** was a woman of strong morals, strong convictions and strong faith. For over forty years, **Tammy** was a proud member of the Good Hope Missionary Baptist Church where she was baptized by the late Rev. Dr. Willis Wilson. **Tammy** served her church family well and faithfully. She was a choir member, member of the Jr. Usher Board, and was also the church secretary. She loved her church and served them faithfully until the church closed its doors. It was only then that she joined the Prince of Peace Church family where she was a faithful member. She loved her Pastor, Dr. Willie Kilpatrick and Lady Kimberly Kilpatrick, often attending several functions at his home. Though shy, **Tammy** cultivated friendships and was starting to develop relationships with her new found church family.

**Tammy** was a proud graduate of the O'Fallon Technical High School class of 1981. But her education didn't stop there. In 2001, at the age of 38 she decided to go back to school and pursue an education in nursing. She graduated with her medical assistant degree from the St. Louis College of Health Careers. This was a proud moment for **Tammy**. But she decided that this accomplishment wasn't enough. She went on to obtain her LPN license from the MET center. This was an achievement that she was immensely proud of. For the last twenty years, **Tammy** gave excellent service as an LPN to several hospitals, nursing homes, and other businesses. All of these companies were blessed to have had her as a part of their work communities.

At the time of her death, **Tammy** was a dedicated employee at the Juvenile Detention Center. She would often tell her children, "All these kids need is a chance and for someone to believe in them." Throughout the years, **Tammy** held several jobs. At the age of 16 she started her career in the work force working for the St. Louis Zoo. She then went on to work for Mercantile Bank, and the Federal Reserve Bank before starting her career in Health Care. Hard work, passion, and dedication were just a few of the many traits that she instilled in her children.

**Tammy** departed this life for life Eternal on Wednesday, November 8, at 11:04 p.m. She was surrounded by her children and loved ones. She leaves to cherish her memories: her children, Latasha, Demetrius, and Terrell; grandchildren, Demetrius Davis Jr., Tammia Davis, Tamisha Murphy, Fallon Davis, Taylor Davis and Terrell Davis Jr.; siblings, Raymond (Regina) Bell, and Ella (Richard) Bell-Patton; uncles, Leon (Bertha) Bell and Jesse Robinson; brothers-in-law, Gregory (Vernice) Davis, Joe (Viro) Davis, and Larry Davis; sisters-in-law, Carolyn Betts and Jannis Davis. 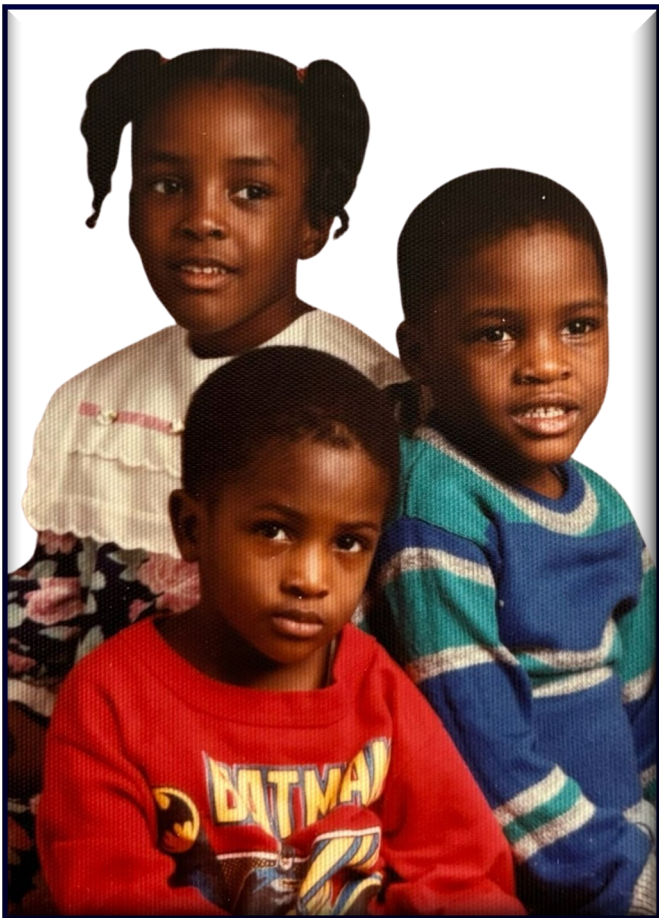
