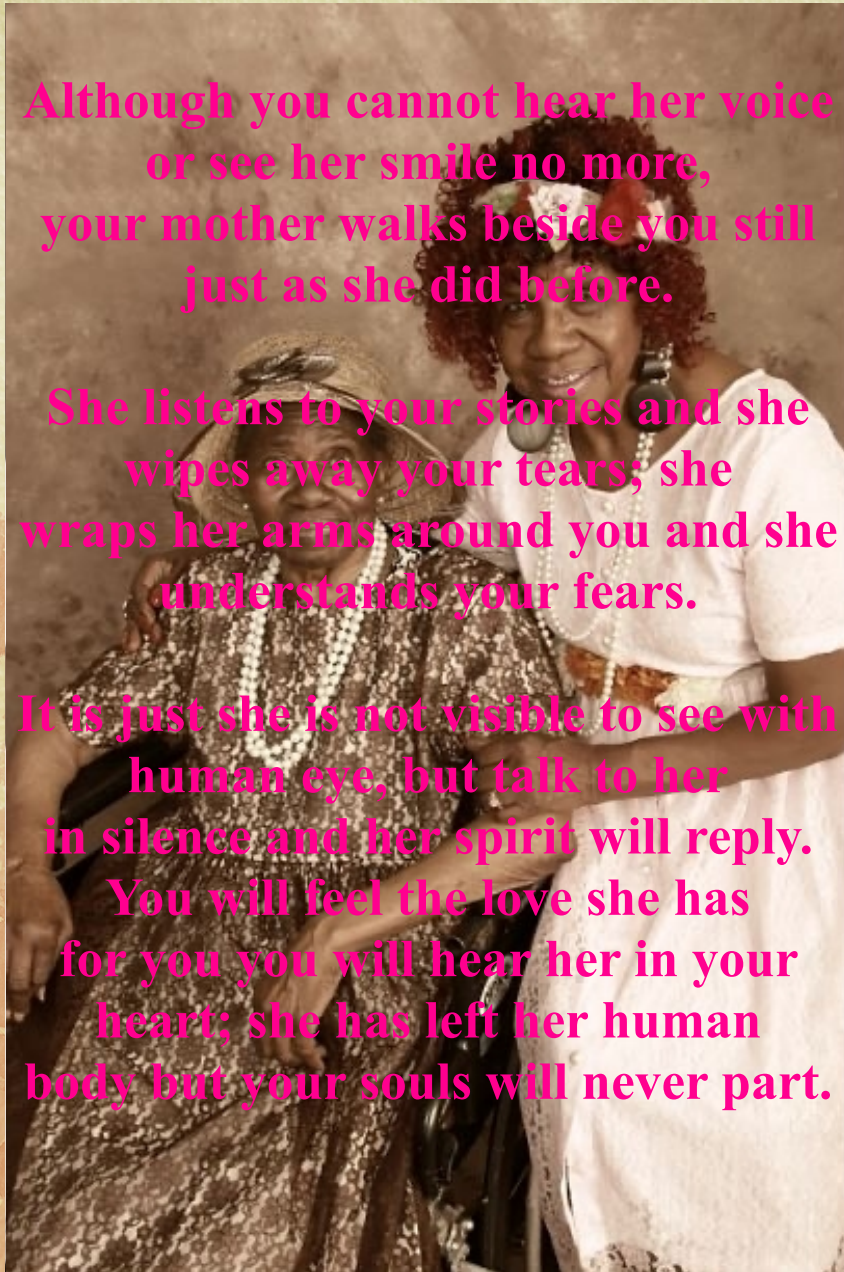
Your Mother
