Would be our fondest wish today.

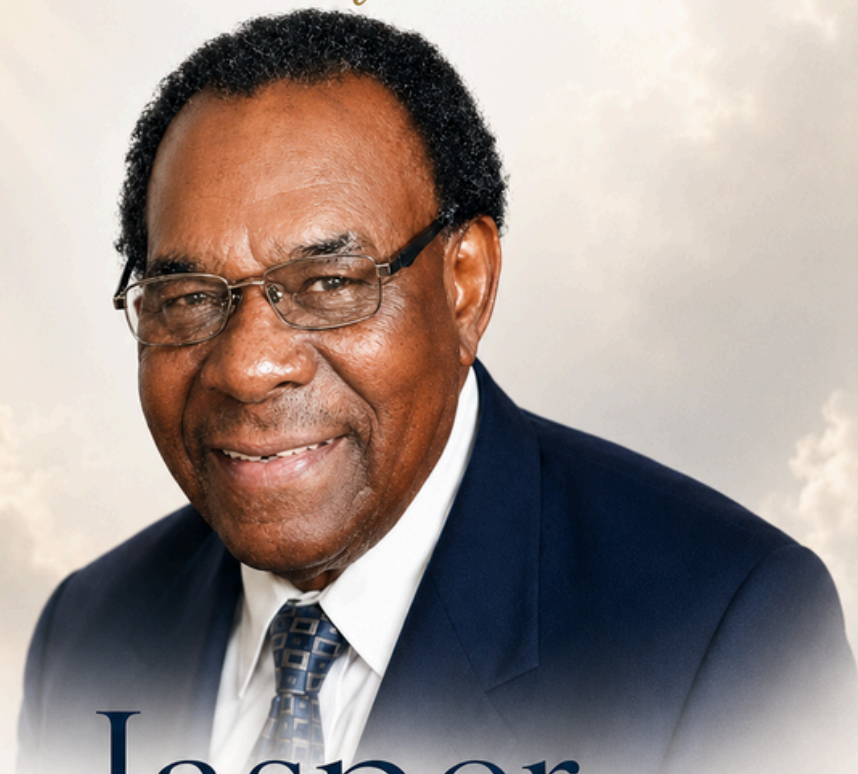
