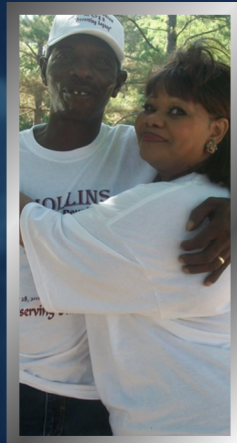
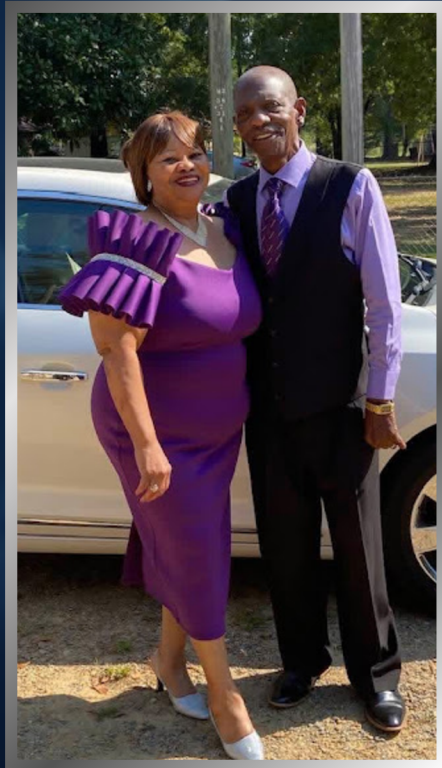

# Obituary

**Jerry Dean Hollins, Sr.**, was born May 23, 1952, to the late Birdia Mae Hollins and Calvin Coolidge Bradfield, Sr., in Vaughan, Mississippi. He was preceded in death by seven brothers: Elzra, Elijah, Eddie Lee, Calvin, Jr., Maceo, Larry, and Silas.

Jerry attended Linwood High School, where he was a running back and wide receiver on the football team, which led to him becoming an avid Dallas Cowboys fan. He was given the nickname "Andy Brown." After integration, Jerry attended Benton High School. Continuing his love of sports, he played summer baseball with several community teams. While attending Linwood, Jerry met the love of his life Murdean Watts, whom he later married. To this union three children were born: Nicole, Jerry, Jr., and LaToya.

In 1965, Jerry confessed a hope in Christ and joined Mt. Zion M. B. Church, under the leadership of Rev. N. B. Jackson and became a member of the youth choir.

Jerry was employed by Yazoo Mobile Homes before relocating to Chicago, where he was employed by Griffin Dewatering in Hammond, Indiana.
