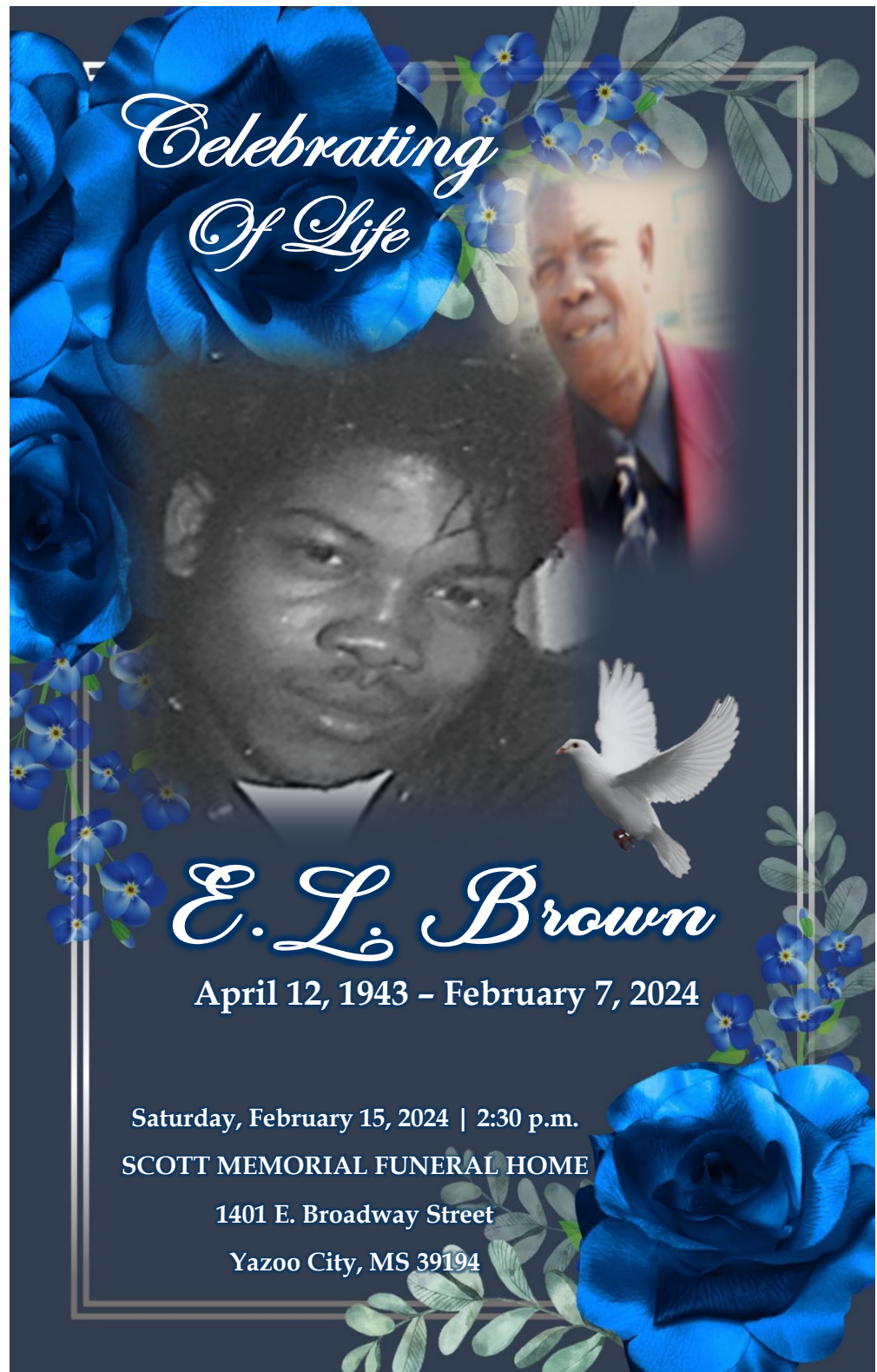

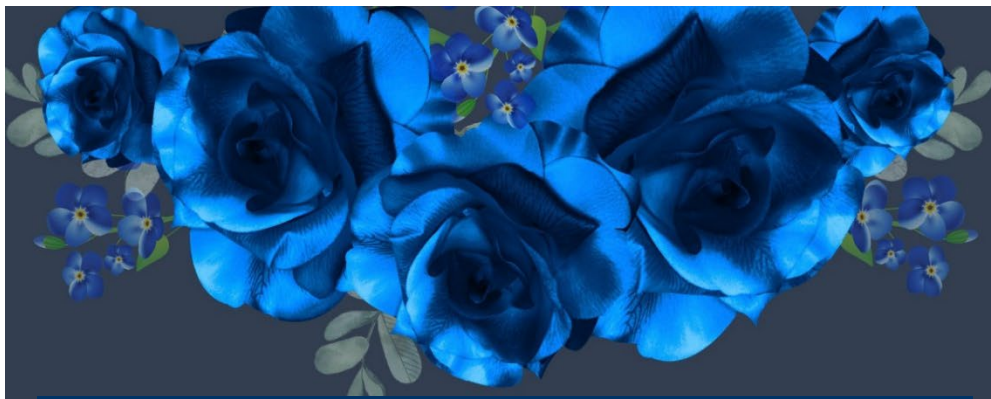

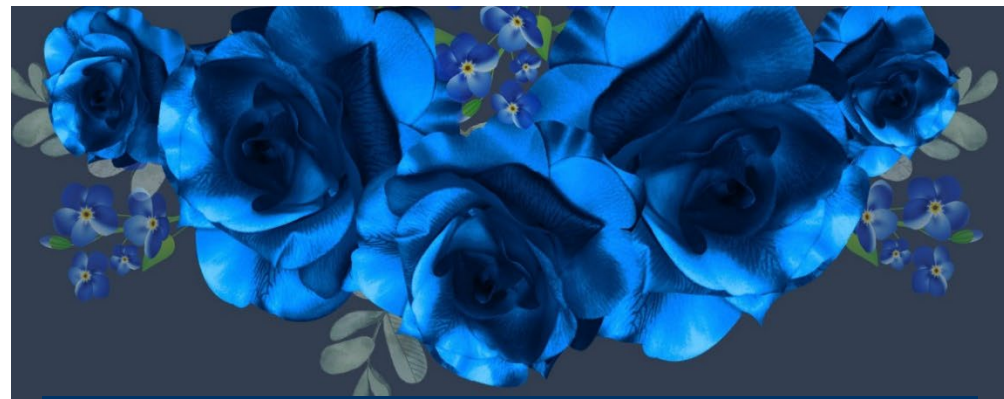
Obituary



EL Brown departed this life on February 7, 2024, at St. Dominics Hospital in Jackson, MS. He was a long-time resident of Yazoo City, MS. EL, son of the late Clifton Brown Sr. and Zanzie Lean (Fanroy) Brown was born April 12, 1943, on Bee Lake in Yazoo County. He was last surviving child from this union.
