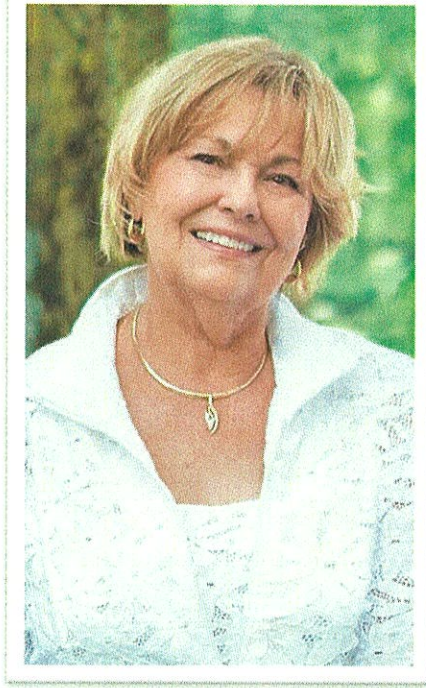

Merrie Carol (Hau) Twohig, born on Christmas Day in 1943, entered eternal life on February 11th, 2026. The cherished only child of Clarence and Millie (Brandt) Hau, Merrie brought light, warmth, and joy to all who knew her.

A bright, beautiful student, Merrie attended St. Mary's Elementary School then proceeded to St. Mary's Springs Academy where she was crowned homecoming queen and graduated as valedictorian of the class of 1962. She went on to earn her degree in Elementary Education from Mount Mary College in 1966. On August 5, 1967, she married the love of her life, Timothy G. Twohig, establishing an adoring, joyous, dynamic marriage that became the steady foundation of their large and loving family. Merrie taught in the Milwaukee Public School System while Tim finished dental school. After his graduation, they moved to Louisiana where Tim completed his service in the US Air Force and later planted their roots back home in Fond du Lac.

Merrie's life was centered on her family above all else.
