


Raymond Lee Bradshaw was born on April 24, 1961, and raised in Glen Flora, Texas, the second oldest of 7 siblings. He was baptized and accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior at an early age. Raymond attended and graduated from El Campo H.S. in 1980. He moved to Houston from Wharton, TX in 2014, where he was joined in holy matrimony to the love of his life, Linda R. Dervis April 27, 2014.

Shortly after moving to Houston, Raymond started a trucking business with his wife. In the year 2019, Bradshaw Trucking was born. Everyone who knew Raymond knew he loved truck driving. After successfully operating his trucking business as it came to a close, he most recently worked for Dana Transport Trucking, where he tragically lost his life doing what he absolutely loved.

Raymond joined the Military, serving in the United States Army. Where he served from 1980 to 1983 in Field Artillery before he was Honorably Discharged.















You gave no one a last farewell.
