Obituary

Mother Lossie S. Brewington boarded the heavenly express on Friday, November 15th, 2024, at 10:45 pm from Wesley Long Hospital in Greensboro, NC.

She was born on December 23rd, 1930, in Black Creek, NC to the late Charlie and Lossie Dudley Spells.

Mother Lossie Brewington graduated from William Cooper High School in Clayton, NC.

Afterward she attended Wayne Community College to pursue additional training to excel in supervision. She had a strong work ethic and loved encouraging others to improve themselves. She excelled as a Supervisor at O'Berry Center in Goldsboro, NC. She retired after 30 years of service in their Environmental Services Division. While there, she made lifetime friendships that became a part of her extended family.

She joined St. Stephens Disciples of Christ Church in Princeton, NC at an early age where she met the love of her life, Carlyle Brewington.
