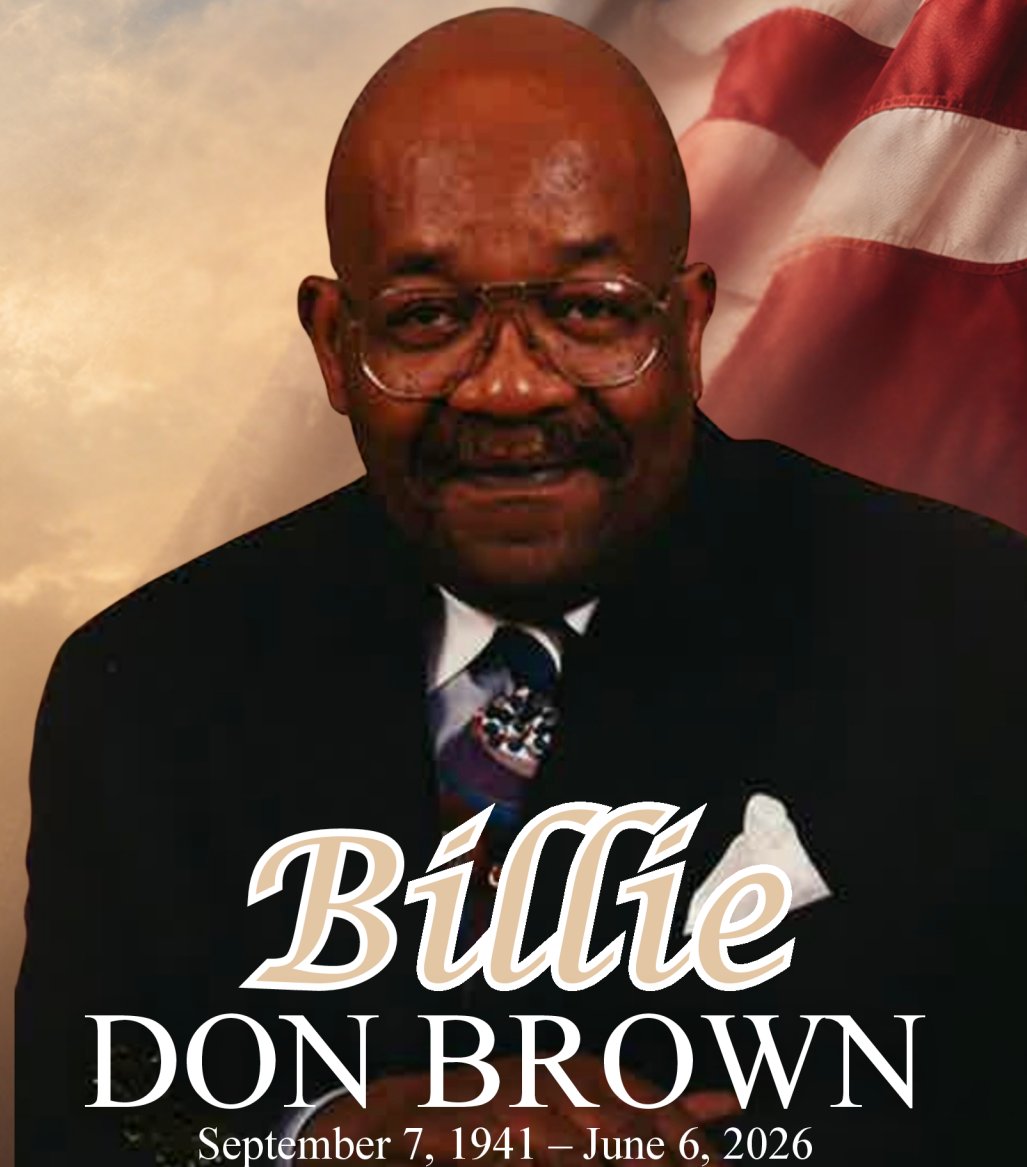

Billie attended school in Grayson, Ok, later transferring to Morris Public schools where he graduated. He attended OSU Tech in Okmulgee, which is when in his second semester decided to enlist in the US Army. He served a tour of duty in Korea and was honorably discharged May 31, 1968. After his honorable discharge from the army he and his wife moved to Tulsa, Ok, making it their home.
