Stanley attended Bedford Methodist School and Tutorial High School before earning a certificate from the Government Technical Institute and a Certificate in Mathematics from the City and Guilds of London Institute. Upon completing his education, he began his career with the British Guiana Lithographic Company before joining the Guyana Telecommunications Corporation.

As a young man, Stanley embraced life with enthusiasm. He loved climbing mango trees, watching cricket, swimming along the Georgetown seawall, and spending time with his siblings and friends.
