Larry Paul Walker, 98, of Sedalia, passed away on Friday, May 10, 2024, at his home in Sedalia. He was born on April 28, 1926, in Dyer, TN, the son of Lester Earl Walker and Ola Lee (Edwards) Walker, who preceded him in death.

On September 16, 1950, in Artesia, NM, he was united in marriage to Joanna Lahvie Davidson, who preceded him in death on September 29, 2023.

Larry's life was marked by his honorable service in the United States Air Force from 1944 until 1966. He served his country with pride during WWII and retired as a Tech Sergeant, having loaded atomic weapons on the B-47 and B-36 bomber airplanes.
