I promise to honor your life by living in a way that would make you proud. I will carry your kindness, your compassion, and your unconditional love with me always.

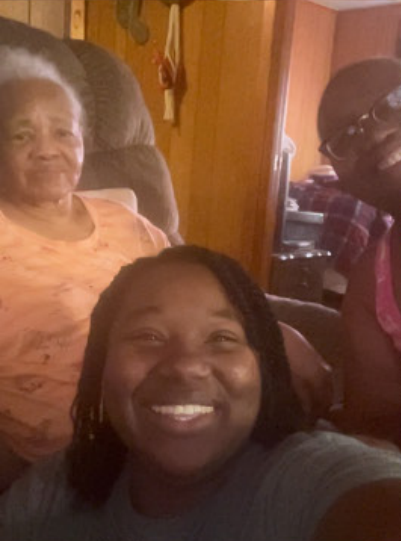
Thank you for being my mother. It was the greatest gift I could have ever received.
