


He was born March 20, 1931, in Neshoba County to the late Hunter Hudson and Mary Wess. He was the fifth child born out of seven children. He is preceded in death by four children, Ricky, Mark, Gloria and Susie Wess, grandson, Genesis (*Bear*) Wess, his parents, Hunter Hudson and Mary Wess, two sisters, Jimmie Lee Hadley, Lula Grace Cobbs four brothers, Mozell Slaughter, Elester, Alberta and James Hermon Wess.

Dr. Wess graduated from Beashie High School in 1952 and was employed with Chahta Enterprise most of his life. He joined the Pleasant Valley M.B. Church at a young age and remained a faithful member until his death. He united in Holy Matrimony to Emma Ree Carter in 1952, a marriage that lasted over 72 years. He could often be heard saying that their marriage did not consist of Sunday School and prayer service every day, but God saw them through and with this union eight (8) children were born.

After being called into the ministry, he became the pastor of Greenfield Missionary Baptist Church of Philadelphia, MS where he gracefully dedicated over thirty-four years of service with love and compassion. His slogan was ***“There are many fields: pea fields, hay fields and cornfields, but there was no other field like Greenfield.”*** Dr. Wess was awarded an Honorary Doctoral degree in 2012 by New Foundation Theological Seminary for his work in ministry.
