Norman A. Peters, 92, Green Bay, left this world very peacefully on Sunday morning, July 20, 2025. He was born in New Franken, on June 12, 1933, to the late Joseph J. and Anna A. (Pigeon) Peters. He served in the US Army during the Korean Conflict with an honorable discharge in May of 1957. On July 23, 1957, Norman married the love of his life Dolores A.
