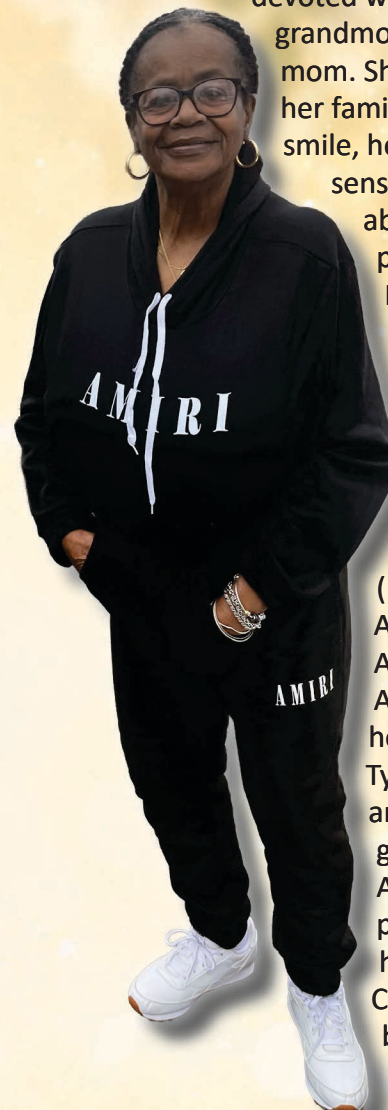
Interment
