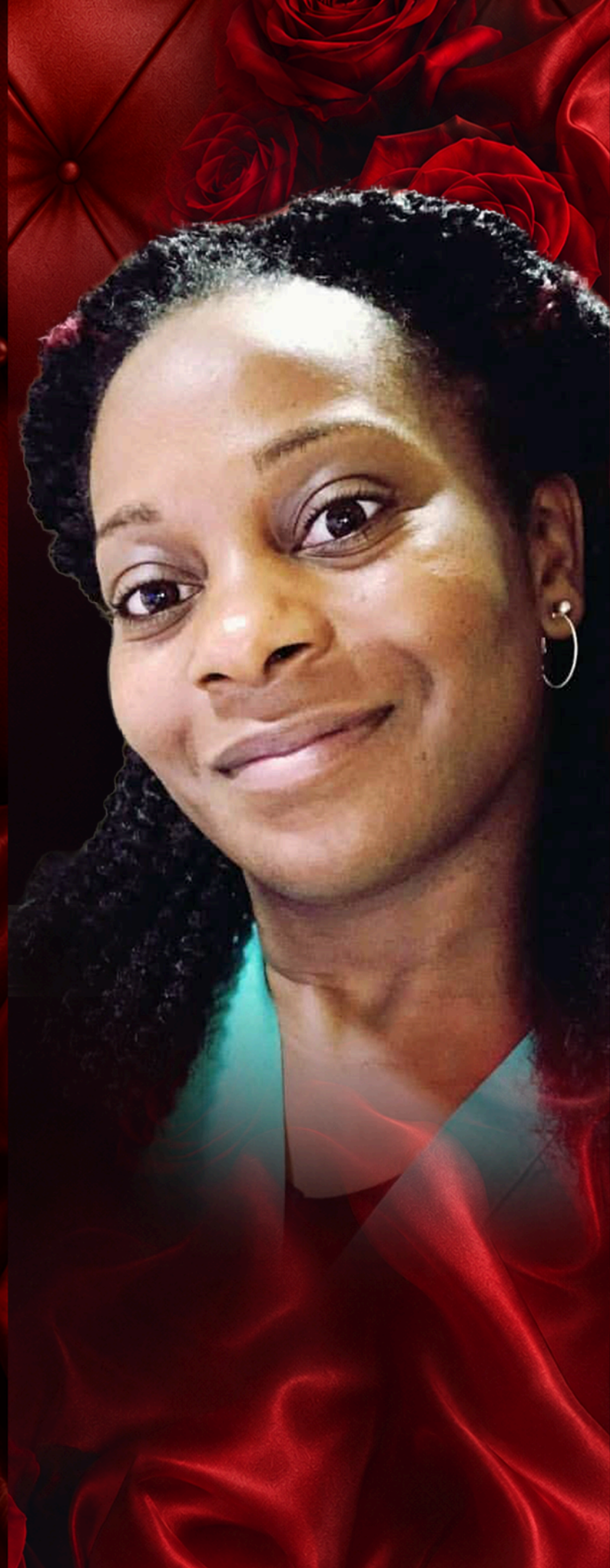




# GOD'S GARDEN

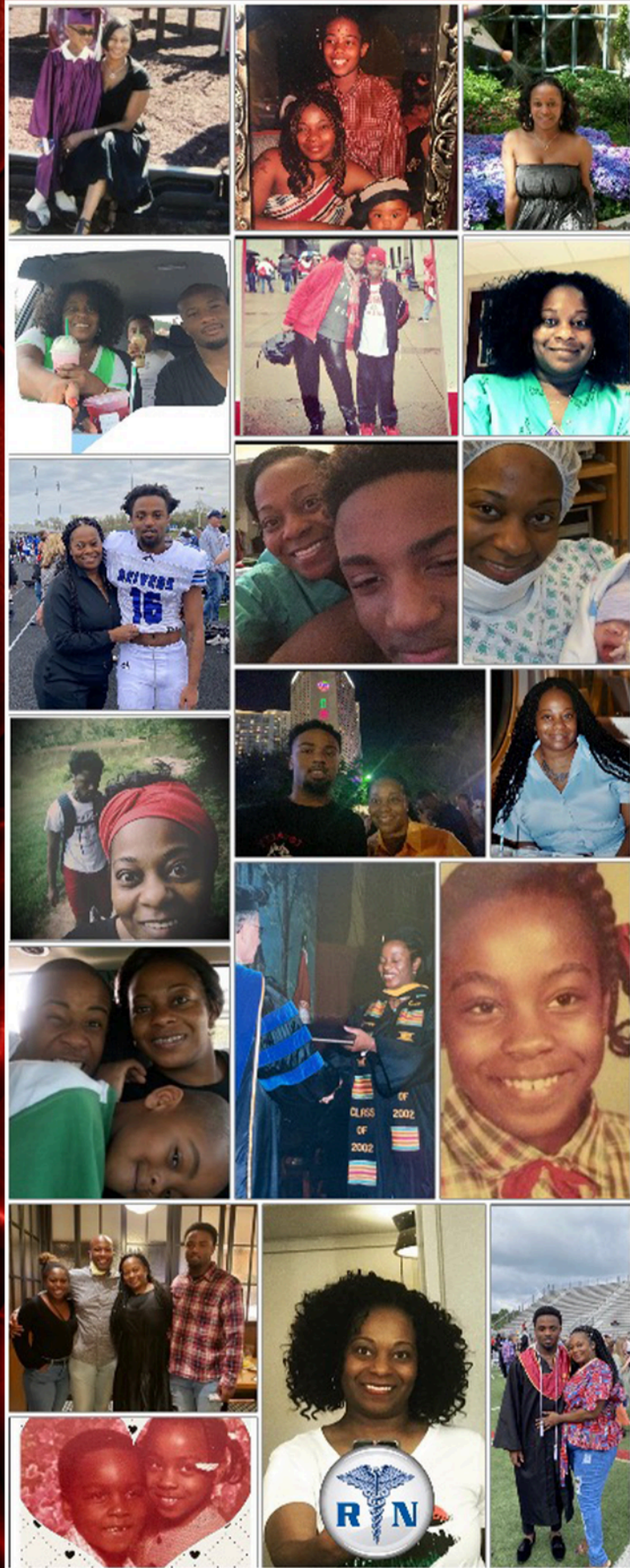
