# Reverend Jim Anderson Dixon, Jr.

Rev Jim Anderson Dixon, Jr. was born February 28, 1944, the first born to Hattie Mae Heard and Jim Anderson Dixon, Sr. Rev. Dixon grew up in Thornton, MS, and he joined Mount Zion Church under the leadership of Rev. C. L. Duncan. Rev. Dixon later united with Smith Chapel M.B. Church under the stewardship of the late Rev Charles Simmons. On November 29, 2024, Rev. Dixon answered God's final call and departed this earthly tabernacle at his Vaughan home.

Rev. Dixon was employed as a mechanic at Canton Automotive Center in Canton, MS. He enjoyed repairing cars, and he happily spent time and energy doing so. Rev. Dixon had a fondness for outdoor activities: hunting, fishing, and gardening. In addition, he started a softball team, the T&T Bravettes. Rev Dixon also enjoyed singing, and he chose to participate in quartet singing. He was a member of The Jackson Goldenaires and The Pure In Hearts. At the time of his demise, Rev Dixon was faithfully serving Big Bethel of Vaughan, MS and New Hope M.B. Church of Holly Bluff, MS.

Rev. Dixon enjoyed serving his God, his ministry, his singing, his fixing of cars, and his family. He could be found surrounded by children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren at the family's Vaughn home or at the homes of one of the children.

Rev.
