Pete said his prayers every night for his family that they travel safely and to say goodnight to his mom and infant son Stacey.

He loved his phone, waiting for his morning call from Marcey on her way to work, face timing with Misty, Travis, and all the grandkids before bed in the evening, always checking on Jim and Sandra to see what Jim was working on.

He enjoyed calling family members on their birthday to give his version of the Grand Ole Opry birthday song, always ending the call with mom and dad, or grandpa and grandma and Bailey sure love you.

Most of us had a special nickname that he used for us, dogs were not left out on this, I think he found them easier to remember than our names. If you have one, he used it often. (tubbles, LU LU, Matilda, Patrick, Charlie, Penelope, Devinski, Sugarplum, Buttons, and the list goes on...) Most of all, Pete had a heart of gold, was loyal, protective and loved his wife Annie with all his heart for the 55 years they had together. He will be waiting to greet her with Heavenly arms outstretched.
