

Lorna K. (Lee) Blochowiak passed comfortably on Saturday, November 9, 2024, at 11:50 am at St. Anthony's Hospital in OKC from kidney failure. She was surrounded by her husband, brother, daughters, their families, and her friends.

Lorna was born in OKC at Capitol Hill General Hospital, to James Hollis Lee and Edwinna (Attebery) (Lee) Wittman. She attended Hayes Elementary School. Later, the family moved to McCloud where she attended school for a time and graduated from Dale High School. There, she was a basketball team member and also participated in the junior play. After high school, she worked at Cook's department store, then Tinker AFB as a key punch operator. Just before getting married, she quit Tinker to become a full-time housewife and mom.

At the time of her passing, she was a member of New Beginnings, which is now at 1203 E. 42nd Street in Shawnee.

Lorna was preceded in death by one brother, Ronald Lee, her parents, step-father, Dale Wittman, and maternal and paternal grandparents. She is survived by her husband of 52 years, Peter J. Blochowiak, Jr., daughters, Angela and Shelly, brothers, Mike, Victor, and Kendal Lee, sisters, Judy (Janell) Aguirre and Carla Craig, and six grandchildren.
