Gillette has been Carl's home since 1952, moving from Laramie as a baby when his dad became the Campbell County Extension Agent. He attended CCHS as a proud Camel, lettering in football, basketball, and track. Graduating in 1971 with honors, he attended the University of Wyoming, earning a Bachelor of Science Degree in Wildlife Management. While at UW he became an avid Cowboy Football fan and remained so no matter what the record. After graduation, he returned to Gillette and worked for Campbell County Road and Bridge before beginning a career in the mining industry in 1979. He retired from Amax Coal after more than 29 years. Second, only in time shared with family and lifelong friends, Carl found his greatest joy, contentment and peace being in the mountains. He lived at his cabin near Deer Haven and Meadowlark Lake as much as possible until his declining health made travel too challenging.
