# LOIS ANN *Toussaint*

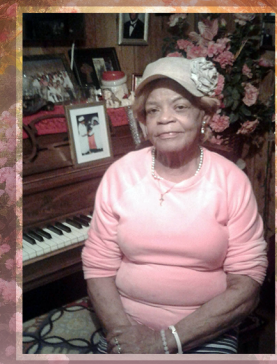
