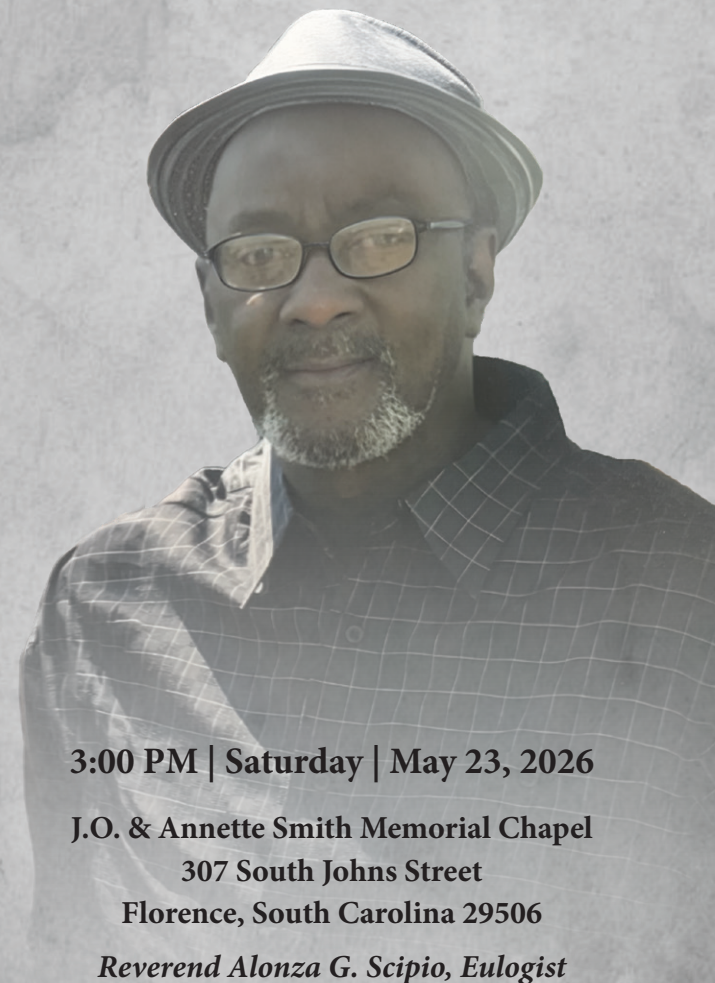

Known lovingly to family and friends as "Brother", Abraham attended Carver Grade School, Wilson Junior High School, and Wilson Senior High School.

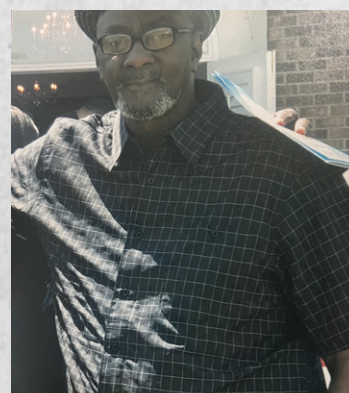
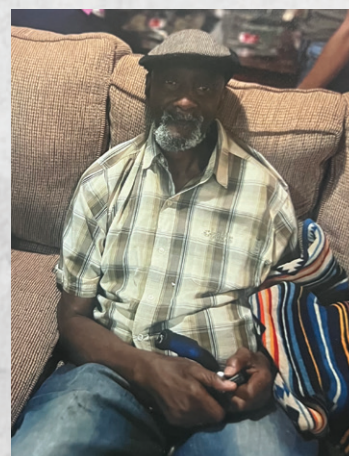
