Nicole Seefeldt, formerly of Clark, passed away on January 29, 2026, at the University of Pennsylvania Hospital at the age of 48.

Nicole Margaret Seefeldt was born on May 25, 1977, in Watertown, SD to Merritt and Linda (Barbknecht) Seefeldt. Growing up in Clark, SD, Nicole graduated from Clark High School in 1995, and later attained a BS degree from South Dakota State University. It was during her time at SDSU, working as a radio DJ that she became enthralled with the musical band The Yalloppein' Hounds, quickly befriending the band leader and transferring her love of music into action by making the brave leap from small town South Dakota to New York City. The trip, meant to last one summer quickly turned into a love of the east coast, and Nicole soon made it her home.

While living in New York City, Nicole initially enjoyed helping her friend Joey with various music events, later working for webmd, and helping youth through the Sunshine Fund. Later moving to Easton, PA, Nicole found herself enjoying improv, working toward her master's degree in social work, and made time to focus on her health.

Nicole courageously faced health issues throughout a majority of her life. Diagnosed with Tuberous Sclerosis, as an infant, she later developed Lymphangiomyomatosis (LAM) which further complicated her health. In 2017, Nicole received a double lung transplant, both saving her life and providing her family and friends with many more years to spend with her. Prior to her transplant, a benefit was held in Clark with her many friends and family providing overwhelming support. Nicole also became an advocate and supporter of the TSC Alliance and The LAM Foundation, even serving as a guest speaker at one of their conventions where she had the opportunity to meet actress Julianne Moore, a fellow advocate.

Throughout all of the frightening unknowns of her chronic illnesses, Nicole never gave up. She continued to live life fully and bravely. She was a deeply caring person who always cared for others above herself. Known for her tender, giving spirit, she was always ready to lend a hand to anyone in need. Nicole was a passionate advocate for the downtrodden, the oppressed, and the disenfranchised. She was also deeply engaged in politics, volunteering her time to candidates and their campaigns. Nicole famously loved people, and although she could be feisty at times, she always made it a point to show her love for others in actions, not words.

Nicole is survived by her mother, Linda Seefeldt; godmother Julie Pereboom; godparents Gail and Melanie Smith; her aunts and uncles Mike Seefeldt, Marshall and Pan Seefeldt, and Janis Pereboom; all of her cousins and other extended family members; and very cherished friends Joseph and Elizabeth Cavaseno.

She is preceded in death by her father, Merritt Seefeldt; grandparents Louie and Elsie Barbknecht and Babe and Edna Seefeldt; and several other family members.
