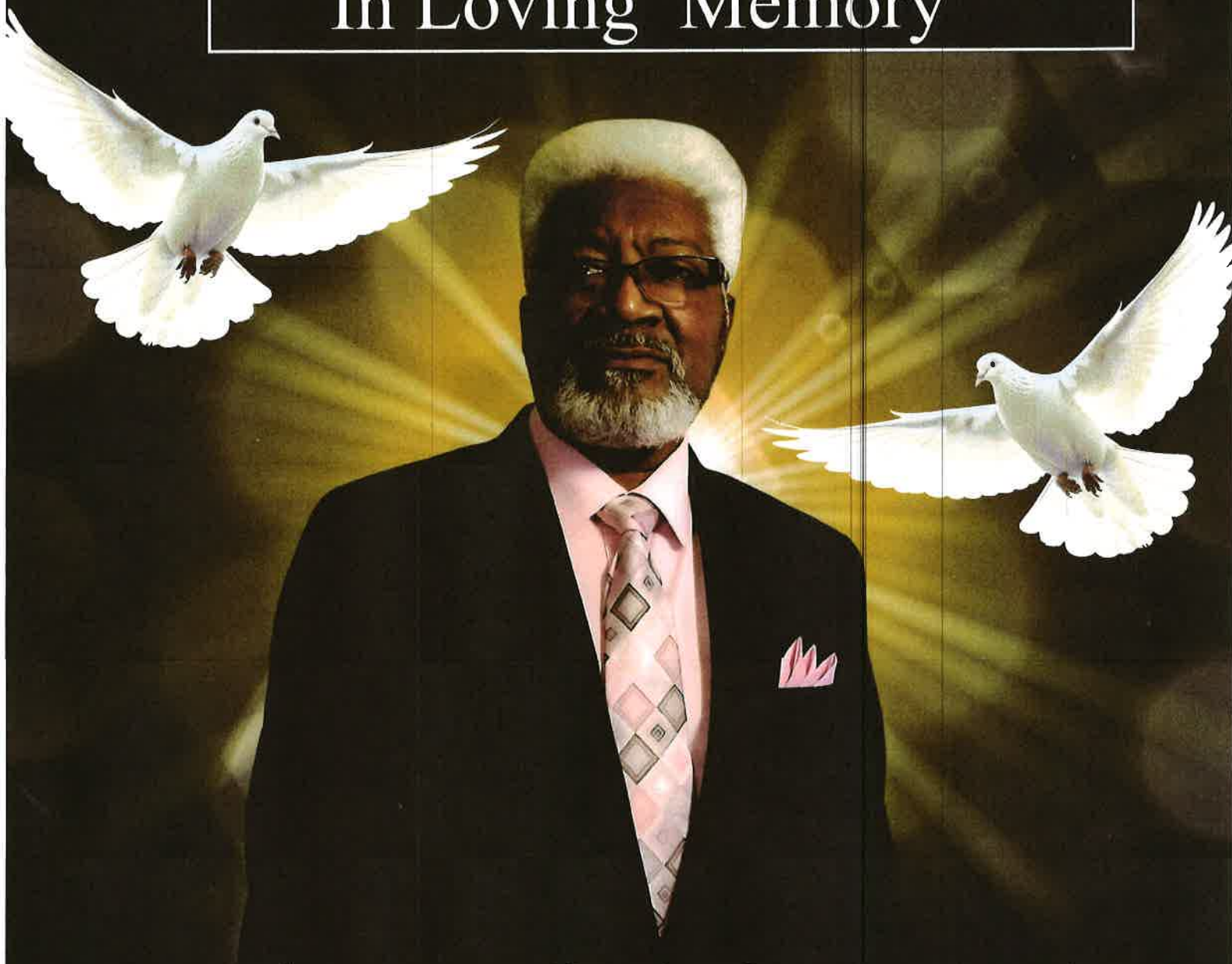


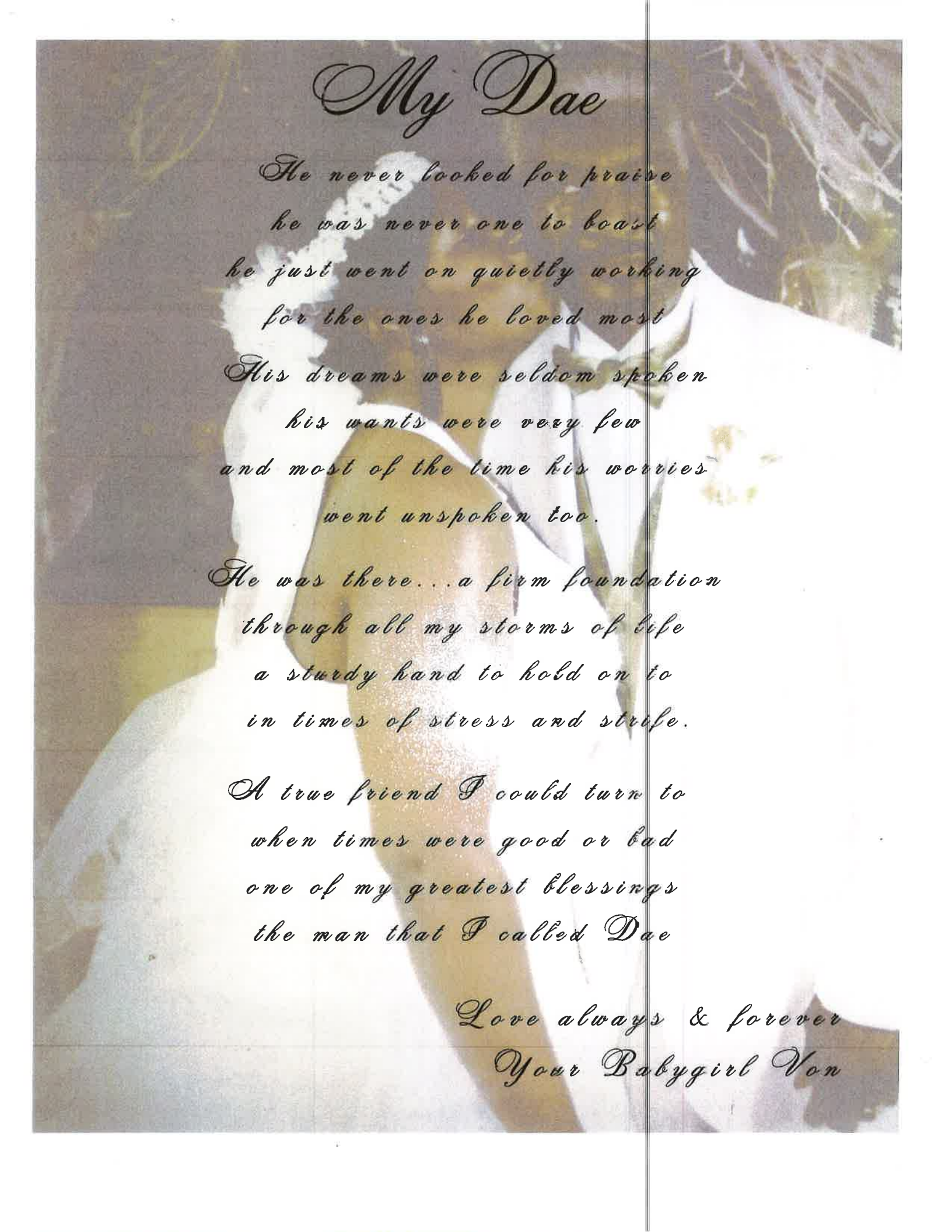

Reflections of Life

Deacon Jimmy Franklin Guinn Sr. was born August 18th, 1943 in Holly Springs, Mississippi to Fred Sr. and Annie Mae Guinn. Being the eighth of nine children. With his creative mindset he became an entrepreneur at a young age. The Guinn family later moved to Memphis, Tennessee to a home that was known by many at "30 W Desoto". Jimmy received his education at George Washington Carver High School. He attended Greater Mount Pleasant Church under the leadership of Rev. Aldridge. After following closely with his pastor, he acquired many skills both spiritually and naturally. It was then that he recognized his gift and love for cooking.

In December of 1961, a new chapter was opened with the marriage to Bessie Williams. To this union five children were born. Jimmy felt the need to broaden his horizons and to seek better opportunities for his family in Buffalo, New York.

He was later presented with a greater opportunity to relocate to Wichita, Kansas. He devoted 40 plus years to the aircraft industry. Thirty-seven and a half of those years were dedicated to Cessna Aircraft from which he retired September 15, 2010.

After his retirement from aircraft, he decided to pursue his true gift of cooking. This is how "Jimmy G's" was originated. Cooking was his love language. He didn't just cook to live. He lived to cook and unite everyone around the table. A provider at heart he fed many.

In 1974, he rededicated his life to Christ under the late Elder Keeler.

He was fortunate to find love again to his loving wife, Dorothy Mae Rogers on March 21, 1981. Together with Dorothy they decided to plant their roots in Tabernacle C.O.G.I.C. He held many positions at the church including being on the Deacon Board, Trustee Board, the Ways and Means Committee, and being a part of the Kitchen Ministry. All of his work was done under the leadership of the late Superintendent Edgar Moore and the now Superintendent Jonathan W. Platt. To sum it all up, he was a true giver from his heart: rather it be a stranger or friend.

Jimmy was preceded in death by his parents, Fred and Annie Mae Guinn Sr. His siblings, Beatrice Netters, Ella B. Currie, Luebirta Barr, Leroy Guinn, Mary Helen Guinn, and Fred Guinn Jr.. Jimmy is now resting peacefully with his beloved wife Dorothy Mae Guinn. His memory will forever be cherished by his two sisters Freddie Mae Davis and Kathryn Guinn. His legacy of love will be forever cherished by his children, Luvarn Pearson (Antoine Sr.), Shannon Armstrong, Markel Guinn Sr., Jimmy Guinn Jr. (Dorian), Tameyl Guinn, Tarrence Guinn Sr. (Theresa). 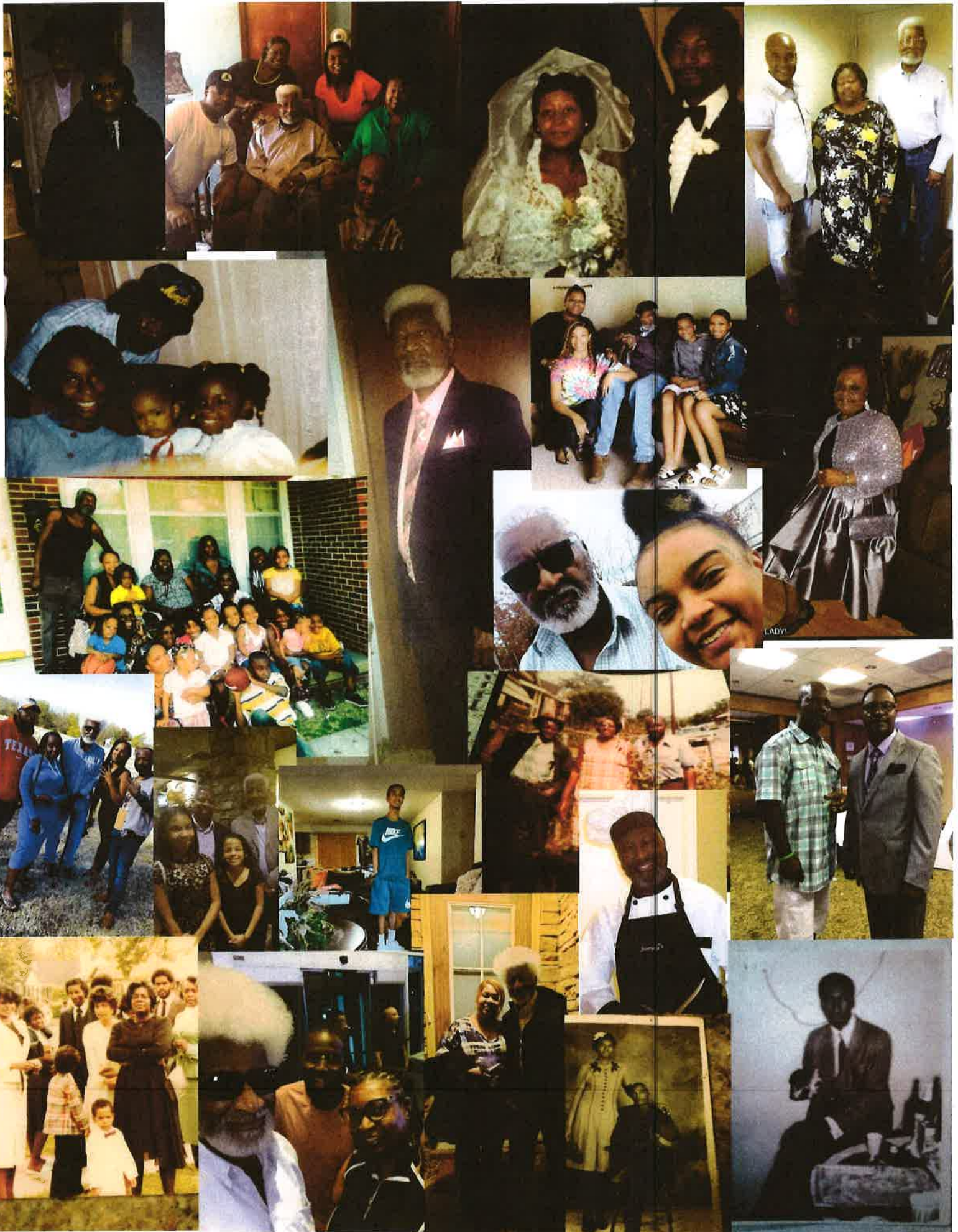
