Vickie Lane Lucas, 75, of Lincoln, MO, passed away on Saturday, August 8, 2026, at Parkview Health Care Facility in Bolivar, MO. She was born on November 14, 1950, in Grapevine, TX, the daughter of Robert “Bob” Eugene Cate and Virginia “Sally Mae” (Bowers) Cate, who preceded her in death.

As a child, Vickie moved with her family from Texas to Edmonson, MO, where she was raised. On March 29, 1969, at Edmonson Baptist Church, she was united in marriage to Russell Lee Lucas, who survives of the home. After their marriage, Vickie and Russell lived briefly in Smithton, MO, before moving to Lincoln, where they made their home and spent the majority of their married life together.

She was a devoted wife and a loving Christian mother who dedicated her life to her husband and daughters. Her kindness, compassion, and faith touched the lives of those she met throughout her lifetime.

Vickie especially enjoyed spending time outdoors. She loved fishing, mushroom hunting, gardening, and tending to her flower beds. She also enjoyed crafting, attending auctions and garage sales, and, above all, spending time with her family.
