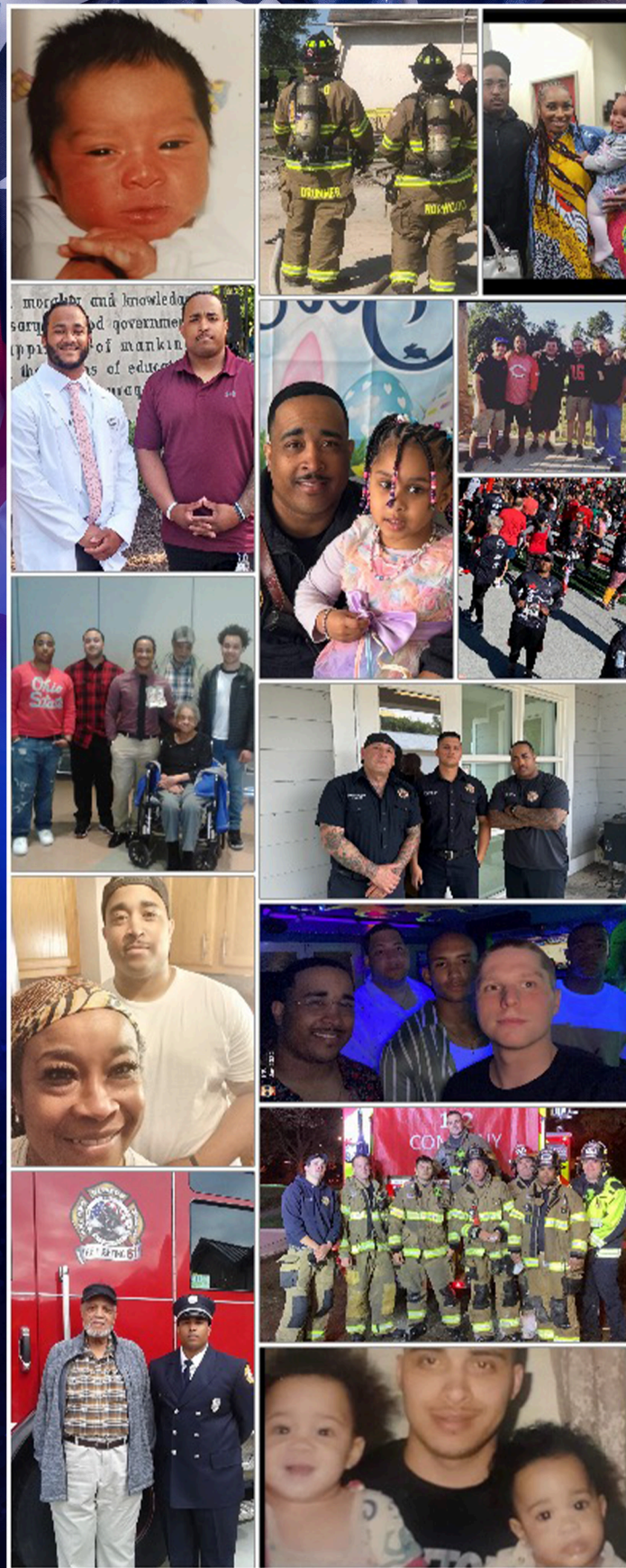

While in high school, he also completed his fire certification through the Columbus Downtown Career Center, earning his fire certificate that same year. He went on to further his education at Columbus State Community College, where he achieved his paramedic certification in 2018.

Tyler devoted his life to serving others as a firefighter, paramedic, and CPR instructor. He began his career with the Columbus Division of Fire as an auxiliary fire fighter. After obtaining his paramedic certification, he went on to serve as a firefighter/paramedic with the Clinton Township Fire Department and the Truro Township Fire Department. As a CPR instructor, Tyler took pride in teaching life-saving skills and empowering others to help in emergencies.

Tyler was deeply committed to his profession and took great pride in helping others during their most difficult moments.
