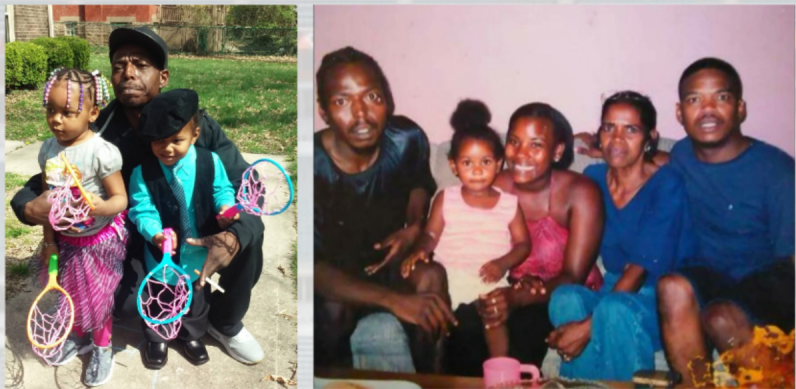
Brian was a proud and loving father to three children: Brian K Allen Jr., Brishawn Allen, and Bryonnah Allen. His children were his greatest pride and joy.
