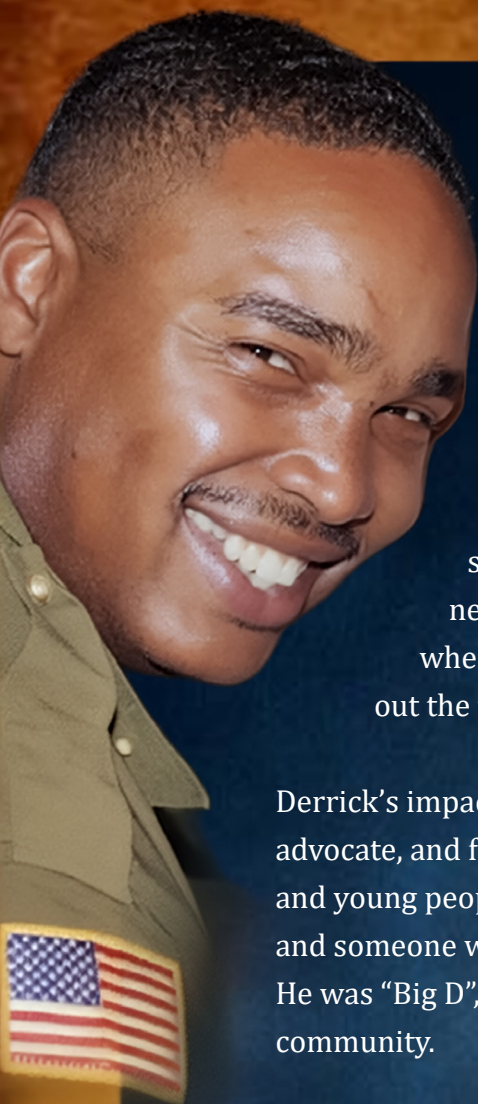

He leaves to cherish his memory his loving mother, Everlene Wilson; his children, Derrick Alexander Jr.



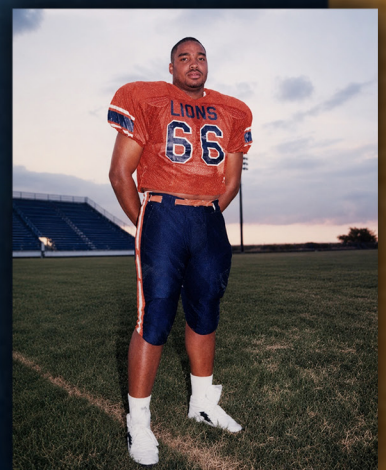

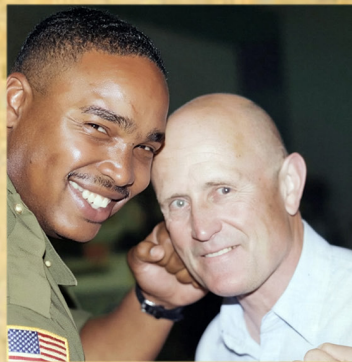
