Jacqueline Ethel Amos Wright Snodgrass, affectionately known as "Jackie" was born in Chicago Heights, Illinois on April 12, 1945 to the late Willie B. and Archie King Amos. Jackie returned to the arms of the Heavenly Father on October 2, 2021.

Jackie was baptized at a young age at Union Evangelistic Baptist Church. She was an active member of the choir, Sunday School, and B.T. U.(Baptist Training Union).

She attended Lincoln Elementary School, Washington Jr. High School and graduated from Bloom Township High School. Jackie was a trained Dental Assistant, and worked as a Dental Assistant for Dr. Emerson Lights, one of the first black dentists in the Chicago area. Some of Jackie's school activities and accomplishments included playing the flute, writing, serving as a member of the Drama Club, Office Attendance team, Distributive Education and the Human Relations Committee. Jackie was the first black sales clerk to work at S. S. Kresge Dime Store in downtown Chicago Heights. She later attended Davenport University where she earned a Bachelor of Business degree.

Jackie moved to Detroit, Michigan in 1963. She married Stanley Eugene Wright in 1965. From this union, Stanley LaMarr Wright was born.

She married James "Jim" Snodgrass in June of 1995. They were married for 21 years until his death in 2016. Shining examples of the endless love of the Lord, together, they would serve dinners to the homeless during the holidays and look after the neighborhood kids.


Jackie loved God with her whole heart and remained obedient to His Word. She joined Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church in Detroit and served faithfully for more than 30 years. She stayed involved with many of the activities and initiatives. She served as president of Group 18, the "love" group, ensuring that members would receive cards and communications from the church to raise their spirits. From serving on the usher board to cooking dinners at the church, security, Christian education programs, Jackie was always there to greet and serve with a smile.

Jackie had a huge heart and an infectious laugh. She could make a friend anywhere she went. Jackie was a devoted wife, mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother. She could always be counted upon to help in whatever way she could. She made sure to keep up with her "extended and blended" family.
