Tina loved to travel especially road trips to visit her many cousins and various family members. As a Homemaker Tina was able to focus on one of her favorite activities – Cooking! Tina was an excellent cook known to make full course meals several days throughout the week including baking sweet treats that she saw in cookbooks, television, or in conversations with “The Girls”- a group of ladies she befriended over 65 to 70 years ago. Tina was a lover of food and enjoyed going to a variety of stores to get the best price and quality. She went to restaurants all over town knowing the daily specials of each one, including having a favorite table and waiter at many.

*Tina loved life and lived it to the fullest. She was a member of The Cleveland Church of Christ where she and Teddy, her husband, of over 51 years attended regularly since 1986. Most of the members and her “Balcony Section” were more like family, especially since she often called you out if you missed more than one Sunday, and they were glad to do the same when her walking began to decline; checking on her during her illness until the end.*

*Tina was a Proverbs 31 woman in every sense – a woman of unwavering Love, Grace, and Strength. Tina is survived by her Husband of 51 years, Alfonza T. Wilson; her daughters Paula E. Henry and Angela M. Wilson; her Pride and Joy grandson, Dennis A. 
*May the Legacy of her love for The Lord, Family, and Friends continue to inspire all who knew her. May her memory live on in the lives of all she touched.*


