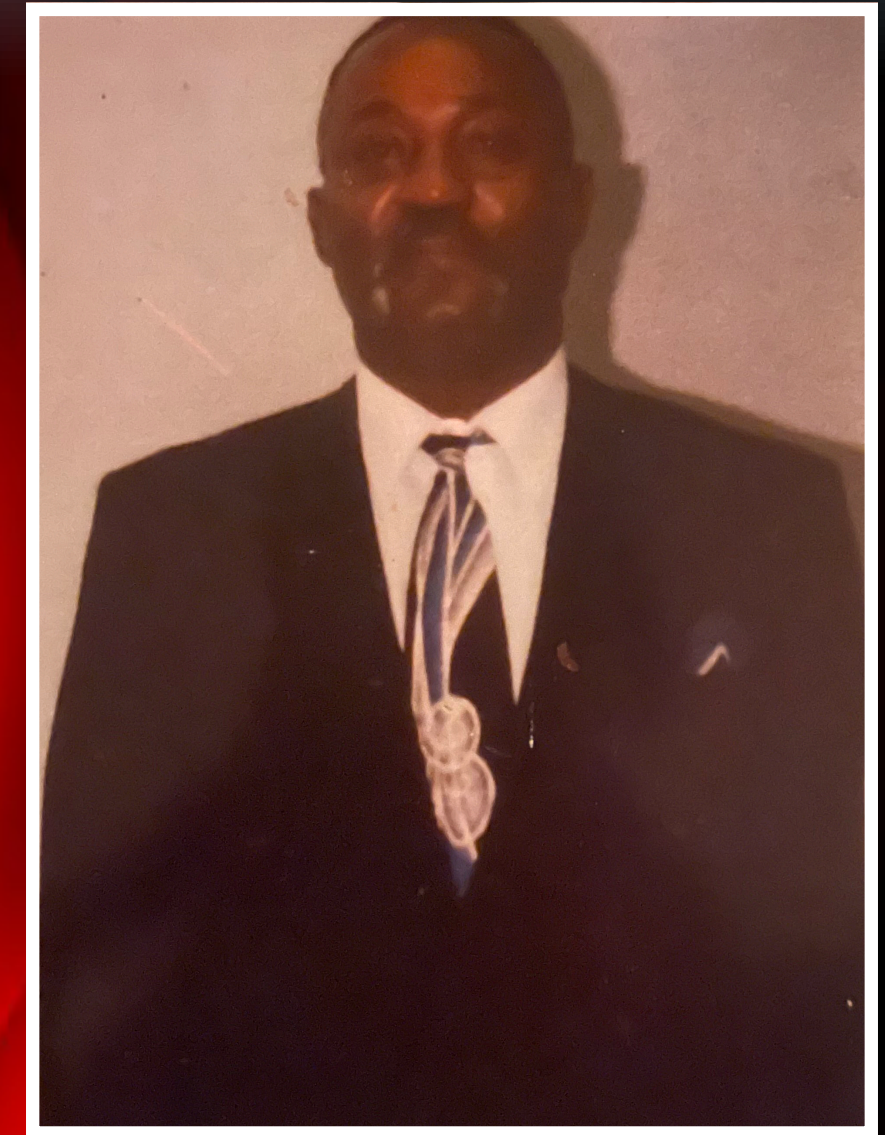
Should You Go First
