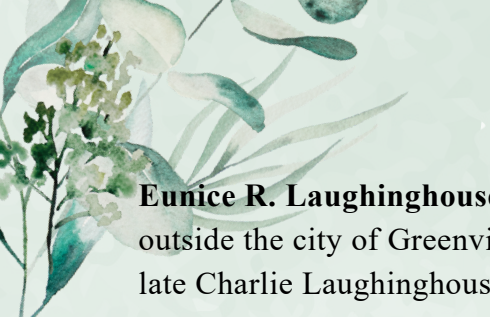
Celebrating the Life of Mrs. Eunice Laughinghouse Walden

Her Story

Eunice R. Laughinghouse Williams Walden was born January 30, 1938 in St. Peters, NC outside the city of Greenville. She was the thirteenth of nineteen children from the union of the late Charlie Laughinghouse and Esther Sneed.

Eunice moved to Brooklyn, New York after marrying Wiley R. Williams (deceased). She later married Floyd Walden (deceased) and moved to Greensboro, NC.

Eunice's early employment was with the Waldorf Astoria in NYC. She later worked with the United States Postal Service in NYC then transferred to Greensboro.
