The music got a little louder in heaven this week as we say goodbye to Mike. Born to Ida Mae Lewis and Alfred Jackson on May 28, 1963, Mike was the youngest of five siblings: Mapel, Rosie, George, and Alfred (all of whom preceded him in death). A proud graduate of Ben Franklin High School and the pride of North Philadelphia, he was better known to the world (and the dance floor) as Dancin' Mike of the Dynamic Dimension.

At 62 years old, Mike was a man who lived by an "old skool" code: if it was broken, he could fix it; if it was on the grill, he could cook it; and if the beat was right, he was going to move to it. A true jack-of-all-trades, Mike was a master with his hands. Whether he was under a sink, behind a welding mask, framing a house, or tinkering with an engine, he possessed a craftsmanship that is hard to find these days. He was the guy you called when you needed it done right the first time.

When he wasn't working, Mike was usually found with a fishing pole in his hand or standing over a smoky grill, feeding the people he loved. But his true claim to fame—one he was never too humble to brag about—was his legendary footwork. From his younger days as the original "Dancin' Mike" to the glimpses of brilliance he'd show off at block parties and family gatherings, he never lost his rhythm or his ability to light up a crowd.

A die-hard Philadelphia Eagles fan through the best of times and the worst, Mike bled midnight green. He brought that same loyalty and passion to his family, serving as a pillar of strength and a source of constant love as a father, grandfather, great-grandfather, brother, uncle, and cousin.

He leaves behind his Wife: Wanda; Sons: Mike, Rell, and Yhakeem; Daughters: Bridney and Marty; Grandchildren: Chiane, Breanna, Shaynna, Saharah, Sariah, Amorah, Meranjalis (Mimi), Tania, Juelz, Keyon, Leo, Nefertari, and Tutmose (Tut); Great-Grandchildren: Luis Jr., Athena, Anaisè, and Taz'lynn; Sisters: Mapel and Rosie; Brother: George; countless nieces, nephews, cousins; and legacy of hard work, loud cheers, and the reminder that no matter how old you get, you're never too old to show off your moves.
