

Quenton Joseph Heid was born January 17, 1934, near Herreid, SD to Anton and Katie (Wingerter) Heid. He grew up on the family farm with his brother Pius and six sisters Rita Diechert, Dolores Todoroff, Francella Butch, Anna Marie Suker, Carol Slaughter, and Kathleen Stevens.

When he was ten years old the Heid family moved to their new farm near Walker, SD. He attended country schools and graduated from McLaughlin High School in 1952. On December 27, 1955 he married the love of his life Vivian Olson at St. Bonaventure's Church in McIntosh, SD. He worked as a lineman in Montana until 1956 when he decided to move home to farm.

He was drafted into the US Army in 1956 and was stationed in Karlsruhe, Germany. After he was honorably discharged in 1958, he and Vivian moved to McIntosh, SD, and Quenton went into the petroleum business. In the early 1960s he started McIntosh Implement with Pius where they sold and repaired Allis Chalmers, Hesston, and David Brown farm equipment until 1978.


