Jeff was a lover of math; he never received a grade lower than an A throughout his education. He was initiated into the Alpha Phi Omega Fraternity. He was known as the "Comedian," by his fraternity brothers. He was forever true to his gold and blue. He loved attending FVSU homecoming, football games, and fellowshiping with his fraternity brothers.
