A TIME TO BE BORN

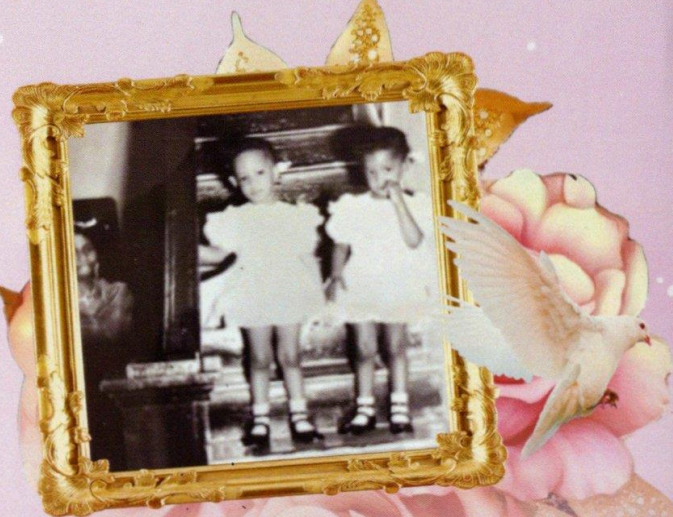

Val was a tireless educator that loved early childhood education. She taught at Clara Barton Elementary. She focused on at-risk and neurodivergent kids. 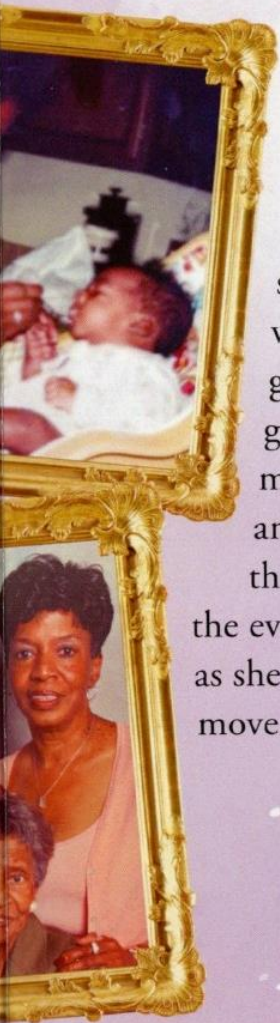


A TIME TO REFLECT

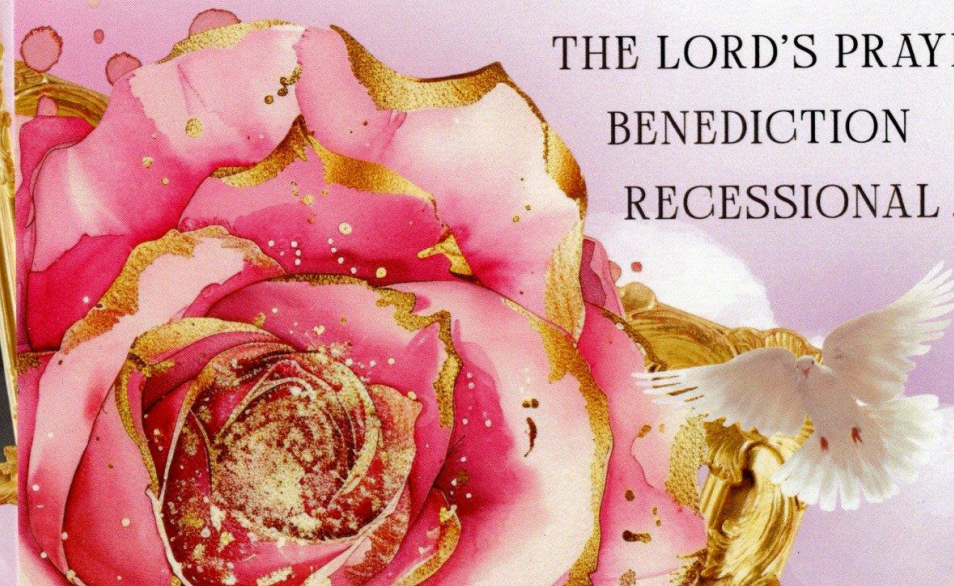
