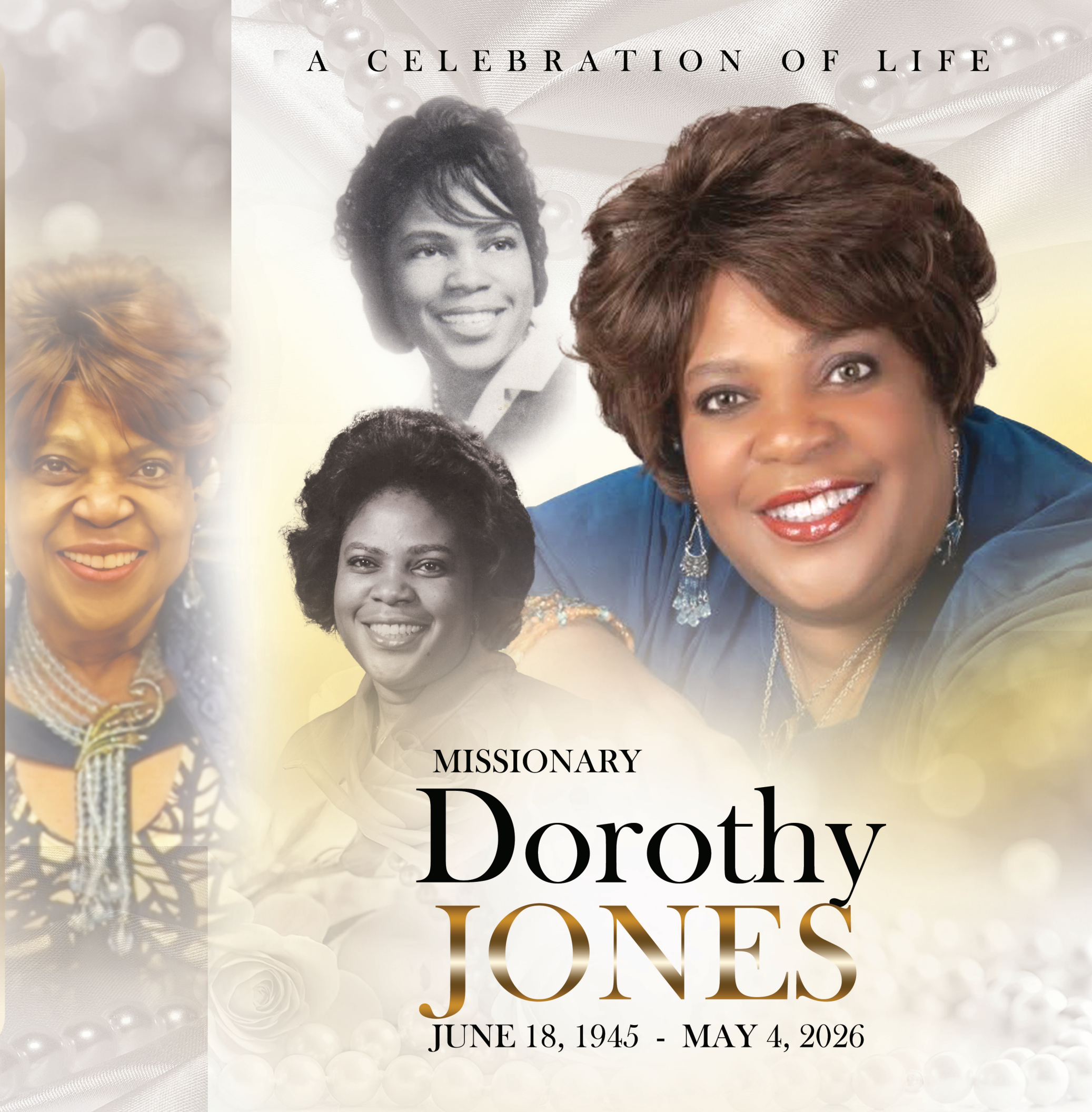

Missionary DOROTHY JONES

Missionary Dorothy Jones, a cherished wife, mother, grandmother, sister, friend, and devoted servant of God, was born on June 18, 1945, in Denver, Colorado. As the 13th of 14 children to Judge B. and Maggie Boyd, her arrival marked a moment of renewed hope for her family and the world at large, coinciding with the closure of World War II. Her sister Jan fondly recalls the joy her birth brought, symbolizing new life and promise.

Dorothy's early years were shaped by her education at Whittier, Cole Junior High, and Manual High School, where she proudly graduated as a Thunderbolt. On March 8, 1963, she united in marriage with the love of her life, Richard Jones, and together they nurtured two daughters, Traci Rachelle and Tshaune Tarelle.

A woman of dedication and perseverance, Dorothy's career journey began with Samsonite and flourished through 25 years at IBM before she embraced real estate and later contributed her talents to the census bureau. Her work was marked by commitment and an admirable work ethic.

Family and faith were pillars in Dorothy's life. She shared a special bond with her nephews Bennie Walee Haamid (MCCOY) and William "Billy" Hike Jr., affectionately calling themselves "the triplets." Music filled her soul, as part of The Boyd Sisters singing group alongside her four sisters—Cordelia, Marie, Elsie, Bonnie, and Jan—where harmony was both familial and spiritual.

Always vibrant and active, Dorothy served on numerous committees including Family Reunion, Manual High School reunion, and acted as a member of the Aurora Board of Realtors. Her heartfelt devotion shone through two decades of leading the family's monthly prayer gatherings, a responsibility she lovingly took over from her sister Elsie Chandler.

She faithfully served on the Mother's Board, Missionary Circle, Volunteer Missions, and choir, embodying a spirit of unwavering devotion. Dorothy's kindness was both quiet and powerful. She gave without seeking recognition, helping many financially and spiritually, with those touched by her generosity coming forward after her passing. Her warm smile shone through hardship, her hugs were known to rock the soul, and her wise counsel guided many. Her lively presence was unforgettable—even when her enthusiastic singing outshone performers on stage, her spirit was unstoppable.

She embodied resilience and grace, teaching all who knew her how to push through life's challenges with dignity and courage.

On May 4, 2026, at the age of 80, Missionary Dorothy Jones peacefully entered eternal rest, holding the hand of her devoted husband Richard and carrying the faith that had guided her throughout her extraordinary life.

She was preceded in death by her beloved parents, JB and Maggie Boyd, and 12 siblings: Marie Beasley, Arthur "Leon" Boyd, Elsie Chandler, Cordelia Revels, Clars Boyd, James Boyd, Orin Boyd, Robert Boyd, Bonnie Mason, Richard Boyd, and Edgar Boyd.
