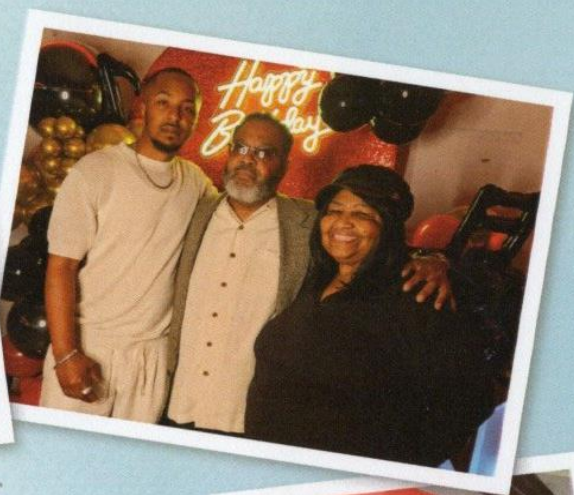
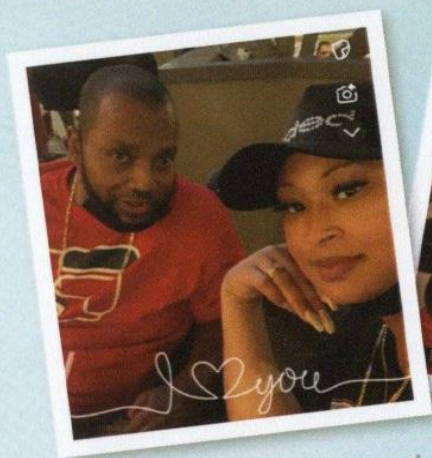


His beat-boxing skills were legendary among friends, and his uncanny ability to identify songs and artists was unmatched.
