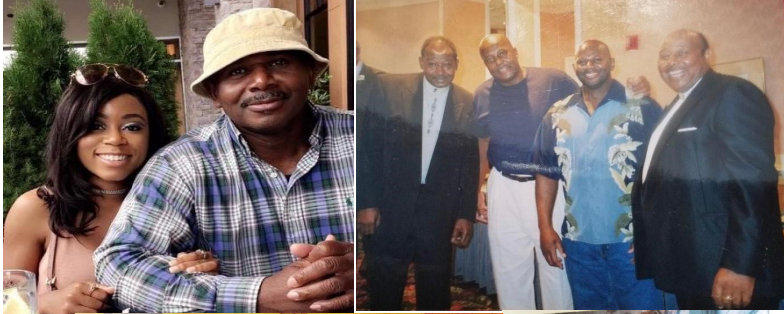

Mr. Wendell Keith Glenn, age 59, the eighth child of the late Robert Sr. and Virginia Miller Glenn, was born on January 2, 1961, in Spartanburg, South Carolina.

Wenn attended the public schools of Spartanburg County where he excelled as an athlete at Byrnes High School. He was selected his freshman year to join the Varsity Football Team and later he became a starter his sophomore season, both tremendous accomplishments. During his athletic career, he played both Running Back on offense and Linebacker on defense, another special feat.

Wenn joined Allen View United Methodist Church at an early age, where he enjoyed using his gift of song and service to others. Wendell joined the All Male Choir in 1995 under the leadership of Rev. Alfred Wright. He was the current President of the United Methodist Men’s Organization at Allen View, which aims to help men grow in Christ. He remained rich in his service to God in both roles until his health began to decline. He equally remained steadfast in his selfless devotion to family and his children, always leading with love and an authentic desire to help others unconditionally.
