Of quiet birds in circled flight.

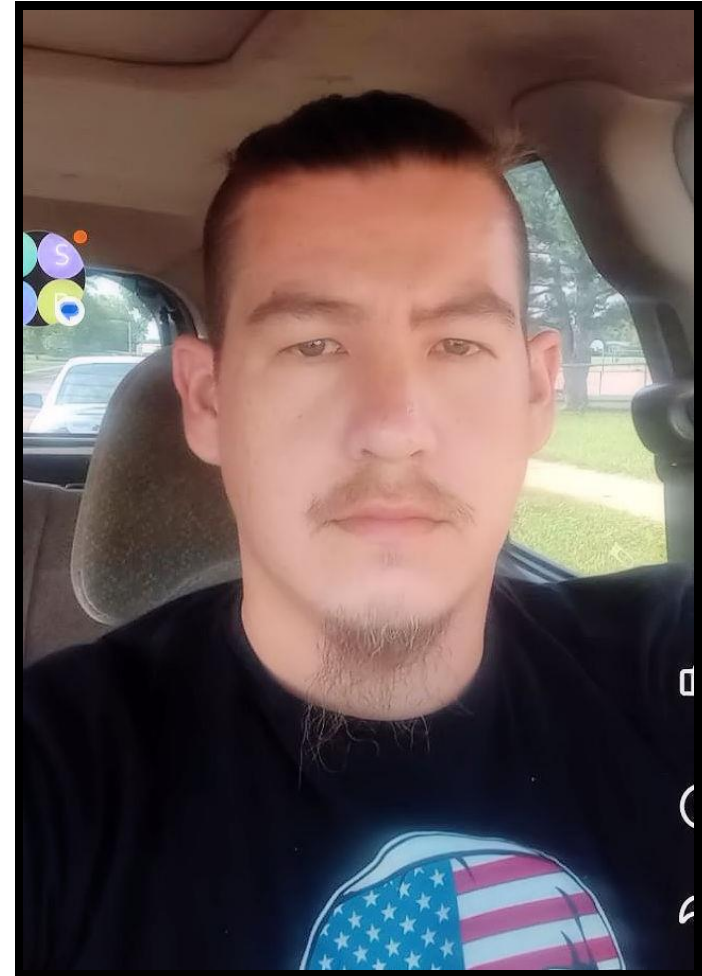
I am the soft stars that shine at night.
