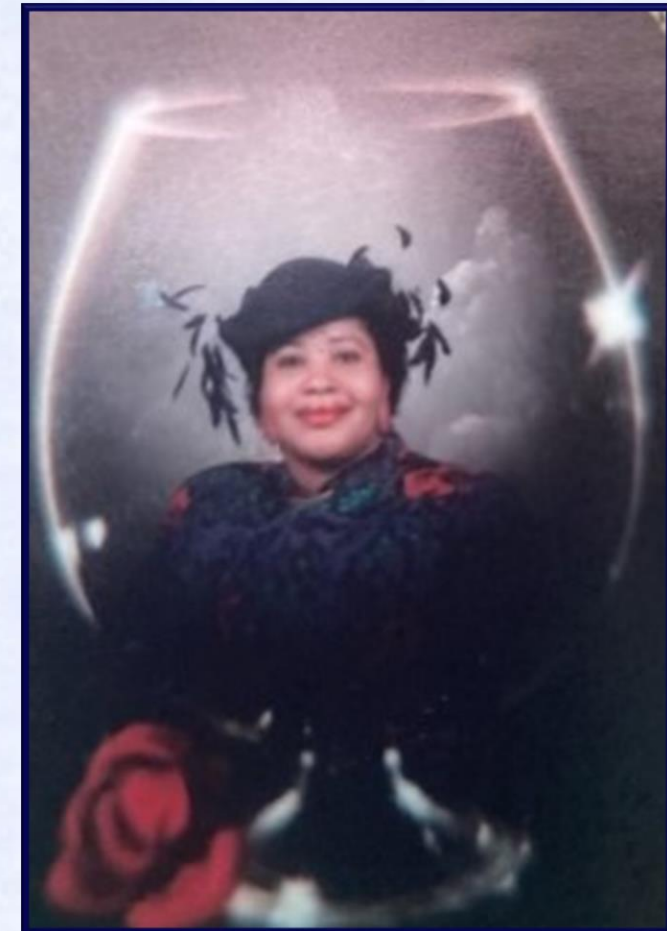

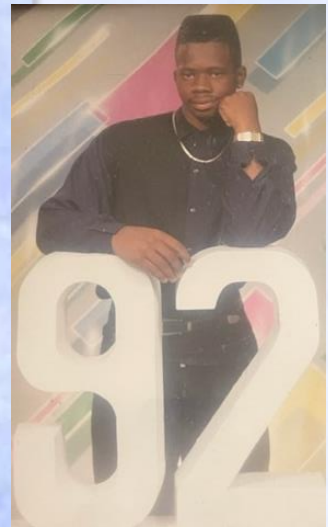

and you will know that I did not leave.

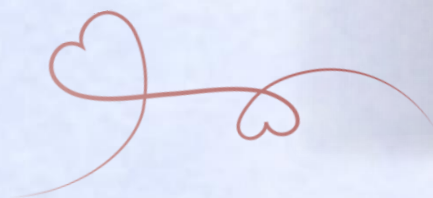
There is no leaving
