 I'll be waiting here for you when we meet again.



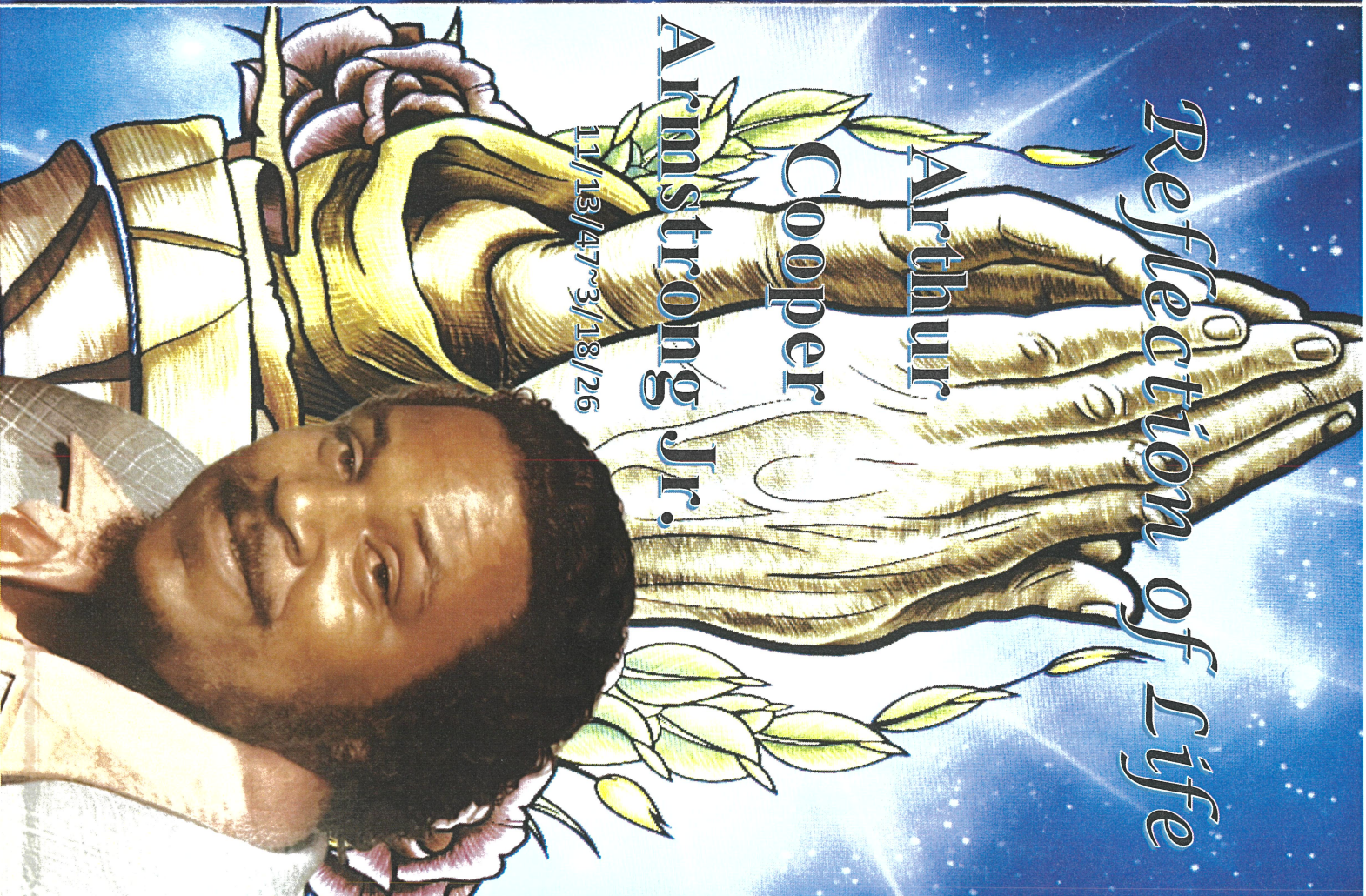
