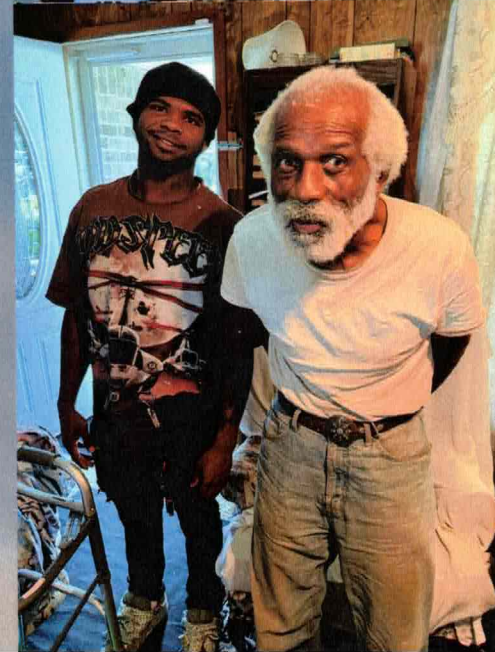
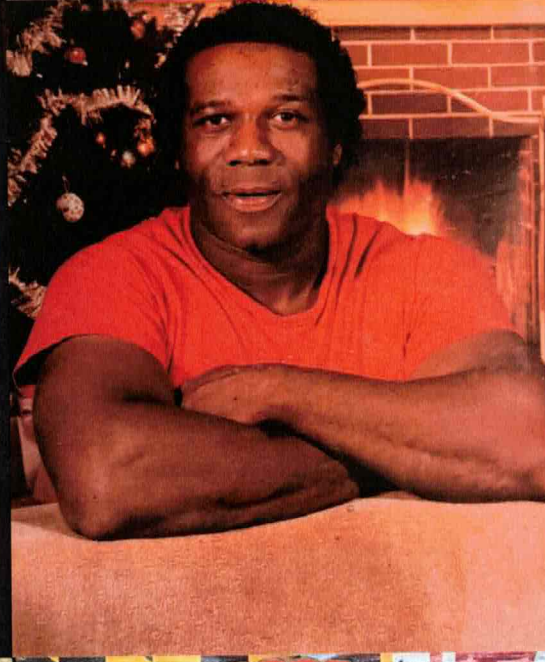
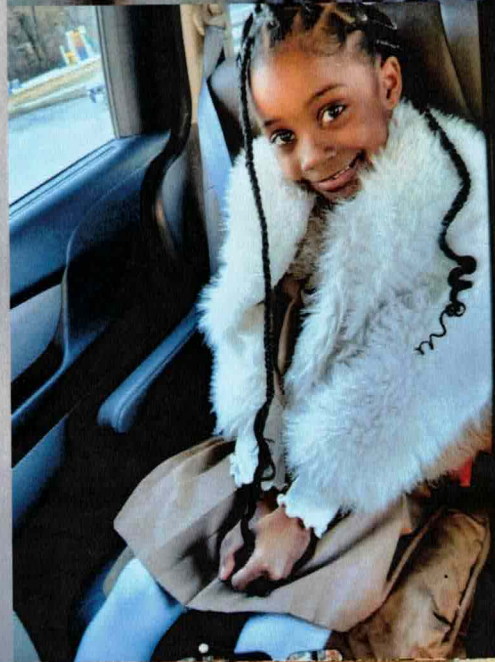
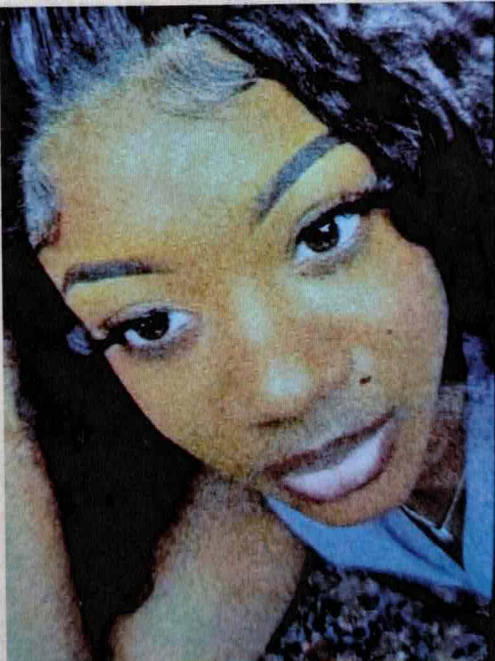
Weep not for me though I have gone

Upon my soul's sweet flight

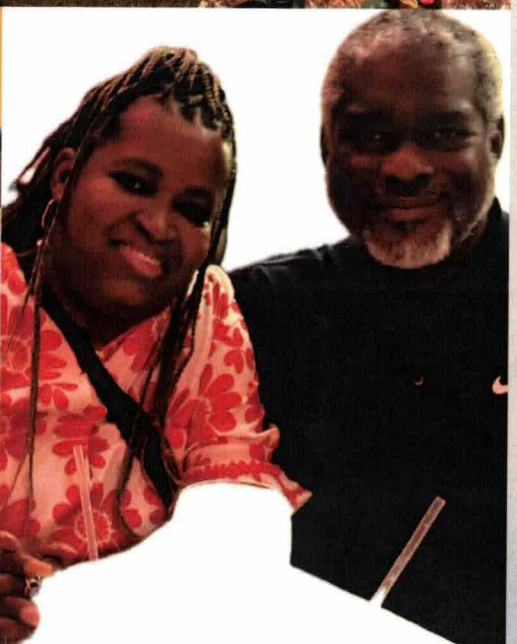
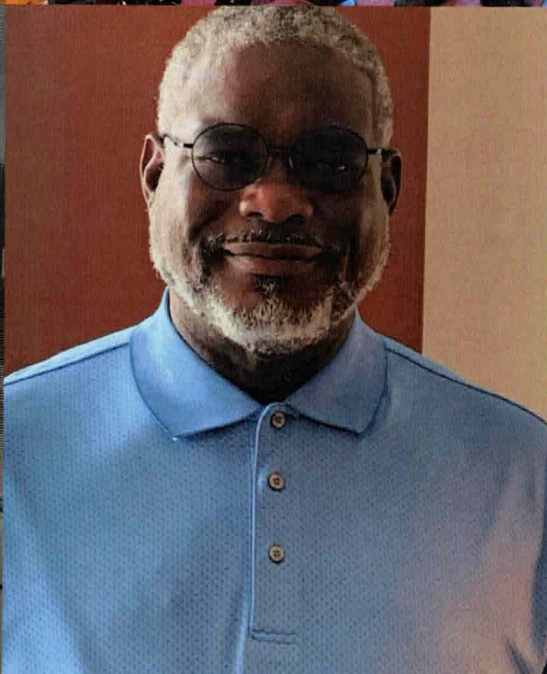
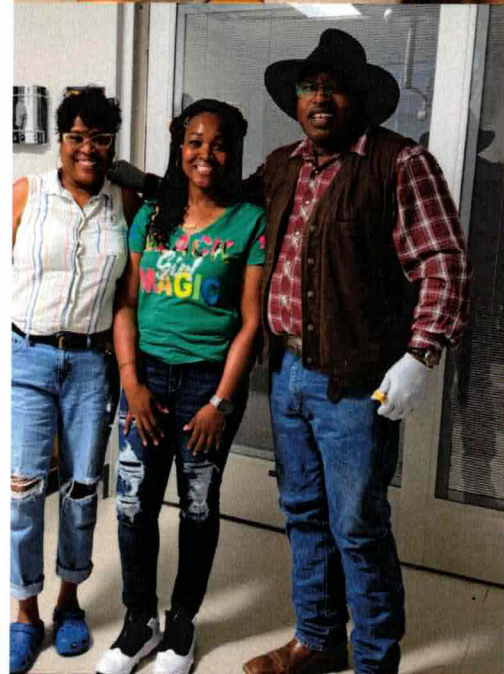
I am at peace, my soul's at rest
