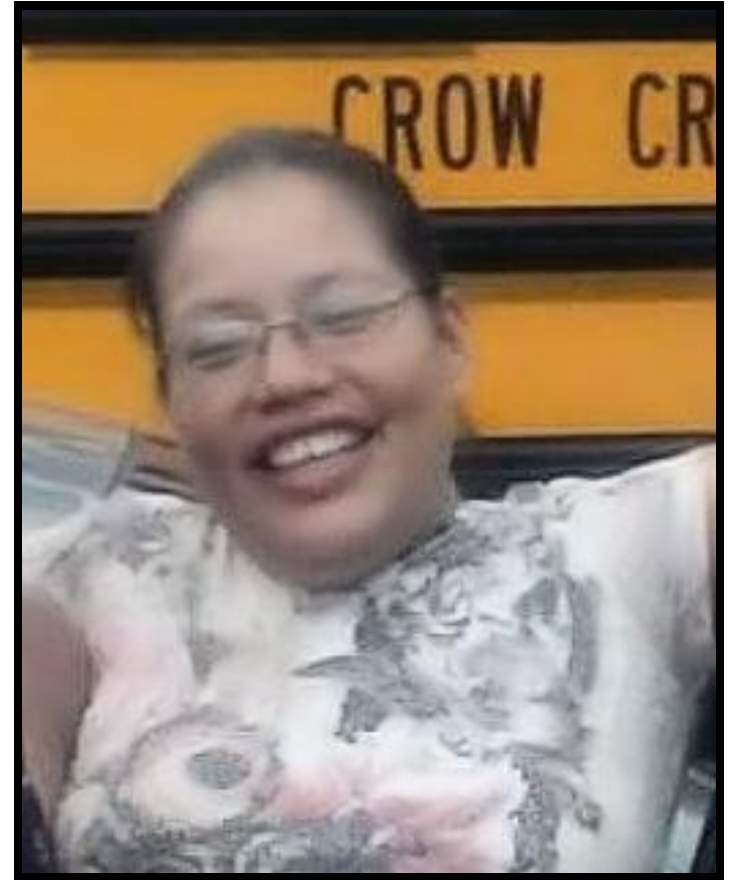
Angelica graduated from Crow Creek High School in 1999. She held various jobs throughout her life. She was a cage manager at the Lode Star Casino for a time.
