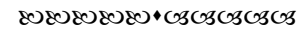

Brenda Ruth Thomas was born June 29, 1950, to the late Lula Mae Smith and the late Bill Smith in Yazoo County.

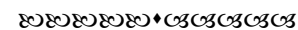
