Father & Mother, once I go to heaven, I hope that I can see you both standing there by the gate waiting just for me.





the memories we have of him.*







Brother,

The shock of your passing still grips at my thoughts, the memories I have will forever be etched in my heart.


Rest in peace, my brother; may the heavens embrace you warmly. Your soul has found peace, and though it was sudden, you have left everlasting footprints that no time can erase.
