To carry on somehow...*

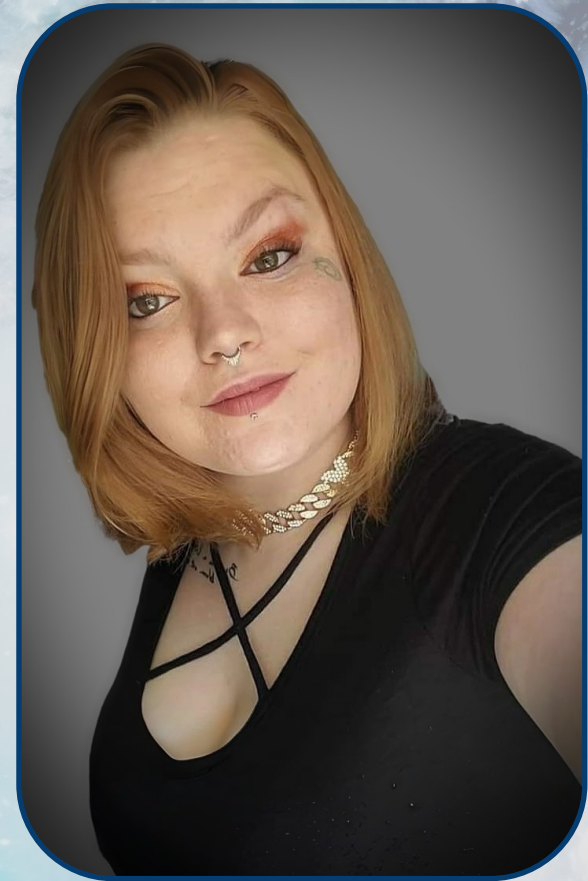
*Focusing on you and your joy in heaven
